Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens?
This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven
will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 1: 1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

REFLECTION/COMMENTARIES

Where is the Body?

Our Risen Lord Jesus Christ could have continued to appear to groups of followers, century after century – until now!

But, he didn't, because the disciples had to be weaned of his Risen-mode of appearance among them lest they think that the victory over Death is meant for human beings alone.

But, as St Paul says, the Risen Lord is the One who 'fills all creation' with His power radiating out from his Risen Humanity.

However, dis-appearance is not the same as absence. We believe that Our Risen Lord is present in many modes, including as St Paul says '... the Church which is His Body'.

That is why the figures in white rebuke the disciples: 'Why do you stand looking into Heaven?'

The Disciples had, rather, to ready themselves to be the Spirit-filled body of Jesus Christ in their own time and place. As we do.

We might pause for a moment to stop staring into Heaven, to ready ourselves to receive the Holy Spirit as at Pentecost in order to be 'The Church which is His Body.'

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (14 -31 May 2020)



It runs for 8 days each year in what is known as an octave of prayer with a core focus of increasing Christian unity around the world. Although this week is traditionally celebrated in January, in the Southern Hemisphere it happens in the

week between Ascension Sunday and Pentecost (that means this coming week!). The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was first proposed in 1908 by Fr Paul Wattson, a Roman Catholic Franciscan Friar. The week invites Christians of every denomination to recognise that we all share a common evangelical spirit which coordinates our work here on Earth. As Pope Benedict XVI once said in a 2012 address regarding New Evangelisation, 'How can we give a convincing witness if we are divided?'. The materials for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is prepared by the faithful community from different countries every year. This year, the people of Malta and Gozo have chosen and prepared the 2020 theme:

"They showed us unusual kindness" (Acts 18:2)

This bible passage tells the story of when Paul, having been taken prisoner, is being carried away to Rome. At one point he is onboard a ship carrying 276 people which becomes besieged by the powerful forces of the sea. Throughout all of this, Paul is unwavering in his belief in God's salvation of all people, trusting in divine providence. The ship is eventually shipwrecked in Malta where the passengers on board, safe and unharmed, are met with "unusual kindness" from the native people on the island.

"Hospitality is a much needed virtue in our search for Christian unity. It is a practice that calls us to a greater generosity to those in need. The people who showed unusual kindness to Paul and his companions did not yet know Christ, and yet it is through their unusual kindness that a divided people were drawn closer together. Our own Christian unity will be discovered not only through showing hospitality to one another, important though this is, but also through loving encounters with those who do not share our language, culture or faith". - extracted from Resources for The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and Throughout the Year, 2020.
