Lent

Lent is an important period in the Catholic calendar that is set aside as a time of preparation for Easter. Easter is an incredibly important event in the Christian calendar. Easter commemorates Jesus' saving actions that give humanity a path to eternal life. Without Jesus' death and resurrection, humanity's condition of original sin would still be a barrier to our salvation; more specifically, entering God's kingdom after death. In order to benefit from God's grace, which is expressed in Jesus' death and resurrection, we must be willing to undergo a form of repentance, and reform ourselves so that we turn away from sin and evil. The Catholic Catechism describes this spiritual transformation as interior penance, and states, 'Jesus' call to conversion and penance does not aim at outward works.... but at the conversion of the heart. Without this, penances remain sterile and false....' (1430). The catechism then goes on to describe what interior repentance is, 'interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life.....a turning away from evil, with repugnance toward evil actions we have committed....it entails the desire to change one's life, with hope in God's mercy and trust in the help of His grace.' (1431). Lent is a time in which Catholics are encouraged to reflect on and work towards spiritual transformations that are necessary to, in effect, become a better person who is unhampered by sin, and harmful desires and actions. Although it can be quite difficult to engage in deep reflection about the purpose of Lent and how we should personally prepare for Easter when we are so caught up in the busy routines of our everyday lives, there are a few steps you can follow:

- Ask for God's help in your spiritual transformation. Trust God to lead 1) you and guide you, and don't focus solely on what you would like to get out of this process. Repentance should be centred on thinking about what God wants for you.
- 2) Reflect on whether you've done, said or thought about anything that was wrong, hurt others and which is contrary to God's moral precepts. For example, have you ever been resentful towards someone, said something unkind to them, or been apathetic about someone's problems? Acknowledge why it was wrong, and confess them to God, with a genuine commitment to change. 3)
 - Reflect on what you can do to make sure you don't make the same mistakes. Think about the thoughts and emotions that lead to you doing or saying something wrong. Think about whether your desires lead you to have thoughts that are harmful. Replace harmful thoughts, emotions and desires with ones that help you become a better person. For example, instead of desiring to be powerful at work and be placed in a senior position at any cost, seek to be a compassionate, caring colleague instead, regardless of your position at work. Make decisions and actions based on these thoughts and desires.

Seeking repentance is a way we can restore and repair our relationship with God, as well as demonstrating an acceptance of His grace and mercy. Remember, believing in God isn't a free pass to eternal bliss. We have to demonstrate to God that we 'bear fruit' spiritually. If we don't repent and remain stuck in our flawed ways, God will hold us accountable for that choice.
