A reading from the book of Genesis

Gen 22: 1 - 2. 9 - 13. 15 -18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.


SECOND READING

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark
Mk 9: 2 - 10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

Transfigured Bodysouls

St Thomas Aquinas famously said: 'If only my soul is saved, I am not saved.' And yet many Christians do think that our ultimate goal is, by the grace of God, to end up as souls in Heaven.

No, I am a human being, bodysoul. If I am to be saved, then this stardust, this fraction of material creation, this earthling, needs to be immersed into Divine energy and light.

The Transfiguration of Jesus Christ, especially as recounted in the other gospels, shows what happens when human nature is in total communion with God. 

Youth Corner

The Books of Samuel (February Youth Group Session)

This month at youth group, we have been taking a closer look at the two Books of Samuel, which recount some of the most recognisable and famous biblical events in the Old Testament (along with those found in the books of Genesis and Exodus) – the story of David and Goliath for example is well-known even outside of religious circles. The books recount the lives and decisions of three individuals whose actions would ultimately define the course of Israel's history as a young nation, whilst also giving us a better and more complete understanding of God's plan for his chosen people, and for us.

The Books of Samuel belong to the *Nevi'im* section of the Old Testament – a collection of books which provide important historical recounts of Israel's history, and her temperamental relationship with God. The books describe Israel's fateful transition from a nation led by *judges* (such as Joshua, Samson, and Samuel himself), to a kingdom ruled by monarchs – a change demanded by the Israelite people, and fuelled by the threat of invasion from Philistia in the southwest.



The resultant rise and fall of both King Saul and even King David are well documented in the scripture of Samuel, as is a recurring theme which becomes painfully clear throughout the Books: faithfulness to God brings success, whilst disobedience brings disaster. As we follow the lives of King Saul and David, and reflect on the choices and decisions they make which shape their stories and relationship with our heavenly father, we are compelled to consider how we too may be making unwise demands and rash decisions as we give in to the temptation of sin. Like both men, we have been called by God for a great mission: to lead others to Him. Like both men, we need to ask ourselves if we are answering the call.
