## REFLECTION

### Women and War

Jesus entered Jerusalem, not as a warrior in the tradition of King David as many had hoped for, but riding simply on a donkey. The disciples and the crowd applauded him, but they proved fickle in their support.

On the other hand, Jesus remained steadfast in his commitment to *non-violent* revolutionary change of the religious and political systems so as to establish the reign of God. Why did he renounce marshalling human and angelic warriors to further his cause?

First, Jesus embodied God-for-us, and God does not want the destruction of those he has created out of love. Second, Jesus had a premonition that an armed revolt would lead to the destruction of Jerusalem and the dispersal of the Jewish people (as occurred in 70AD).

Third, another Gospel (Luke) recounts that as Jesus laboured up Mount Calvary he turned to some wailing women and said, 'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, weep rather for yourselves and for your children.' He knew that they suffer grievously in armed uprising. This is seen in barbaric reality in our own time with women being tortured and raped in campaigns of terror, trafficked into sexual slavery, suffering the loss of sons, husband and lovers.

We could take a moment to pray that the Church of the 21st century, successor of the pacifist Church of the first three centuries, may enter on a new period of reflection on these issues, grappling with the desire to protect the innocent, yet always challenged by the man on a donkey, Divine Prince of Peace.

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### Pope Francis proclaims "Year of St Joseph"

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris Corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

## The Book of Kings

This month at youth group we continued on our journey in unpacking the different books in the Bible- and during March we looked at the first and second book of Kings. Originally written as one literary work, they provide a continuation to the events which occurred in the previous books of Samuel. It has been regarded as the final part of a series commonly referred to as Deuteronomistic History and recounts the reign of King Solomon to the division of the northern and southern kingdoms into Israel and Judah respectively and finally, the demise of both entities. Although the book of Kings is a source of important historical information about Israelite kingdoms, it is also a narrative which embeds deep spiritual lessons which we can consider and reflect on in our everyday lives.

The First Book of Kings describes the early days of King Solomon's rule, where he presents himself as a humble and obedient servant of the Lord- his request for the gift of wisdom and judgement translates into a story which allows readers to witness how God worked through his people. Maintaining a willingness to listen to God's word and remaining faithful is something we may struggle with as we encounter the temptations of sin in our everyday lives- yet understanding and acknowledging your mistakes, seeking and turning back to the Lord through reconciliation are just some ways in which we can repent. This was something King Solomon failed to do as he began to focus more on the physical blessings of power, wealth and women, neglecting not just the Lord but also his spiritual wellbeing. Following his death, the documentations of the consequent ruling Kings gives a bleak and devastating reality of what our world will look like without the Lord- idolatry, suffering and distress.

The incorporation of various prophets throughout the book such as Elijah, Elisha or Jeremiah impart a hopeful message as they attempt to lead the people of Israel back to the Lord, speaking on His behalf. It is a reminder for us that no matter how distraught and chaotic worldly events may be, peace can always be found in the Lord. Their trust and faithfulness in the Lord- accepting that He will provide, both spiritually and physically (as seen in the story of Elijah and the widow of Zarephath) are some key takeaways we can meditate on. Perhaps we should examine our own commitment to God- are we giving enough time for Him, or are we placing too much emphasis on other material parts of our lives?
