COMMENTARY

Amos was called by God and sent to prophesy to the people of Israel. Amaziah, on the other hand, was an official employee of the crown and was responsible for the cultic activities at Bethel, the royal shrine. This passage does not explicitly tell us why Amos was not wanted. It simply states that Amaziah tells him to flee, lest harm come to him. The prophet defends his call from God and his right and responsibility to prophesy in Israel. He was not connected with the court or with a particular shrine, nor had he belonged to any prophetic guild. His coming to Bethel was due entirely to the command that he had received from God.

The verses of this passage presume a community waiting for God's word, a prophetic oracle that will announce peace. Confidence that God will respond rests in the conviction that they are God's own people; they are faithful people; they trust in God. The salvation described is associated with prosperity, suggesting that the people's distress has something to do with economic misfortune. Love, truth, justice, and peace are characteristics of covenantal relationship. Love is covenantal loyalty; truth is covenantal faithfulness; justice is the covenantal righteousness that comes from God; and peace is the wholeness or harmony that results from the covenantal relationship. These covenantal virtues are telltale marks of God's manifestation. This revelation of God is the salvation for which the people long.

The second reading opens with a benediction, a blessing from God that comes to us through Christ. Believers are not chosen because they are holy and blameless, but that they might be made holy and blameless. Salvation is the cause not the consequence of righteousness. Furthermore, believers are chosen for adoption into the family of God. This grace is received through Jesus, God's beloved son who redeemed us by his blood. The author insists that this was done so that God's plan would be brought to fulfillment, the plan to bring all things together in Christ. Adoption, redemption, and forgiveness of sin are all pure grace, gifts from God, bestowed on us through Christ.

The gospel recounts the first missionary venture of the Twelve. Although they are given the power to drive out unclean spirits, it is quite clear that they can only do this through the authority of Jesus. They are initiated into the mission of Jesus and they must participate in it in a truly self-sacrificing manner. They are directed to preach repentance, drive out demons, and heal the sick. Since the presence of demons and the diminishment caused by illness were considered concrete evidence of the power of evil in the world, people believed that exorcisms and healings were victories of God's power that broke the bonds of evil. The reign of God is established in place of the reign of evil. Thus Jesus brings the Twelve into God's saving work.

The Catholic Church in Canada - A Painful Reminder

If you've been following the news of late, amidst news of COVID-19 outbreaks across the country you might have read about the hundreds of graves, often unmarked, of indigenous children in Canada that have been uncovered at several residential schools across the country. This includes the remains of 215 children in Kamloops Indian Residential School on June 6 2021, and a further 751 unmarked graves at the Marieval Indian Residential School in Saskatchewan, majority believed to be of school children, on June 25 2021.

While these schools are not in operation any longer, they were from the 19th century right up until as late as 1998. Some 150,000 Indigenous children were forced to attend these state-funded Christian schools, where children were exposed to physical and sexual abuse and thousands died from diseases and poor living conditions. Children were beaten for speaking their native tongues, reminiscent of the kind of treatment that the children from our own Indigenous people's Stolen Generation were subjected to under the assimilation policy.

Cities in the provinces of British Columbia, Saskatchewan and News Brunswick have cancelled several celebrations for Canada Day which was on 1 July in the wake of what the Indigenous communities calls the "cultural genocide" in the residential schools system. Three-quarters of such schools were said to have been run by Catholic missionary congregations, with the remaining quarter being run by United, Presbyterian and Anglican churches. On 4 June 2021, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau called on the Catholic church to 'step -up and apologise' for the role the Church has played in the abuse of children at these aforementioned church-run boarding schools, many of whom never made it back to their families. On June 25 he said he was "deeply disappointed" that the Roman Catholic Church has yet to offer a formal apology and urged Pope Francis to fly over and apologise on Canadian soil. Pope Francis has expressed his sorrow at this matter, and has come out urging the full cooperation of Canadian political and Catholic leaders to help shed light on this matter, and to seek reconciliation and healing. This comes at a time when there have been reports of at least six Canadian Catholic churches being burned and destroyed on Indigenous land in response to the news of these mass gravesites at residential schools.

In the face of such traumatising news, we may be left wondering how it can be that such unspeakable evil be done by one of our own, by people belonging to the universal community of faith. We are taught to love others as ourselves, to have respect for the dignity of all humans, and to promote values of charity, love and hope and yet events like these remind us of the weakness and depravity that we can all fall into. When we see the use of power gone wrong, and deeds meant "for the greater good" being carried out in scandalous fashion (scandal in this context meaning leading others to spiritual ruin), we can start to understand that if we don't regularly check-in with God, open up our lines of communication and read his teachings carefully, we as a community can lose sight of God and stray from His ways.
