COMMENTARY

Jeremiah announces a future wherein God's promise of redemption will be fulfilled. Though Jeremiah is a southern prophet, the redemption that he announces is for all the people. A shoot, a sign of new life springing from previous life, will be raised up for the Davidic house. Jerusalem, the city whose name means 'foundation of peace', is here given a new name, 'the Lord our justice'. Thus the real foundation of the city's peace is justice, and the basis of this justice is the quality of its commitment to the Lord. The oracle itself sketches the character of the future covenantal relationship between God and the people.

The psalmist asks for insight into God's saving ways, presumably in order to walk according to those ways, to sing God's praises, and to offer thanks for God's goodness. The righteousness of God is attentive to both the sinners and the anawim or humble (vv.8-9). Sinners too will be taught that wickedness will be punished, while the humble will be assured that their righteousness will be blessed. The 'way' that the Lord shows is probably the law. It is in obedience that the will of God is to be found. The psalm clearly draws the connection between covenant and wisdom. An intimate relationship with God calls for a response from the covenant partners.

Paul prays for the spiritual growth and maturity of the Thessalonians. He does not pray that love increases, but that their capacity for growth be expanded so that they can fill it with love. Such love breaks out of any ethnocentric bounds and, like the love that Paul himself possesses, resembles the inclusive love of God. Paul implies that the coming of the endtime should be an incentive to righteous living. Such a way of life will ensure that his converts will be found blameless in holiness when they must appear in the light of God's glory at the time of the coming of Christ. His urgent exhortation encourages the Thessalonians to conduct themselves according to the ethical and moral standards of the Christian tradition.

Jesus speaks of cosmic disturbances and distress on earth that are coming. These upheavals are really signs that portend the advent of redemption. They are probably less predictions of actual historical events than they are metaphorical images portraying the end of one age and the birth of another. Apocalyptic imagery is frequently employed in describing the entrance of God onto the stage of world history. While a theophany of this kind is generally associated with divine judgment (cf. Ezek 32:7-8), in this case it precedes the coming of the Son of Man and a time of redemption. The fundamental exhortation is: Beware! Take Heed! Be Alert! Don't be caught by surprise! The exact time of the revelation is unknown. That is why believers must avoid any kind of behaviour that might jeopardise their watchfulness.

The Book of Revelations

As we reach the end of our collective journey in dabbling into and exploring different books of the Bible in youth group, our final session in November revolved around the book of Revelation (and not Revelations as many have thought). The book of Revelation, the last book of the Bible, can often be intimidating to many due to its complex and extensive use of symbolic imagery and the abundance of apocalyptic visions.

During John's exile on the island of Patmos due to his preaching of the gospel in Asia, John (most likely John the Apostle) writes a prophetic letter to the seven Churches of Asia to pass on his account of the prospective vision provided by God. Throughout the book, John conveys the messages and warning from God to each of the seven churches and describes the time of judgement through a series of twenty-one events (or more specifically, three sets of seven events). From the breaking of the seven seals to the blowing of the seven trumpets and the pouring out of the seven bowls, each of these led to different consequences such as the seven final plagues. The description of this grand judgment on the sins of mankind shows the grave consequences of sinfulness. This, however, is not to scare us from God but to encourage us to stay strong in our faith and live holy lives.

The book of Revelation provides the clearest portrayal of tribulation and what occurs during it. Undoubtedly, the events that occur during tribulation are horrific and those who do not believe will suffer. You may wonder; if God is loving and forgiving, why would he bring upon this chaos and destruction? First of all, we should understand that God is not harsh nor cruel and he does not delight in making people suffer. He sends these apocalyptic events so that mankind will turn to him. He encourages us to turn from sinful actions and lead holy lives. God loves every single one of us and wants us all to be saved and to rejoice in eternal life. God assures us of Christ's future triumph over evil and His re-creation of the world for believers. Whilst it is easy to dwell on the judgment so prevalent in the book, we should remember that the message of this book is indeed hopeful amidst the horrifying visions: there is a promise of Paradise for the faithful. Revelation reminds us that there is hope beyond hardships and that we should trust in God's plan for us. It is a constant reminder of the need for reflection, repenting and faithfulness, and an encouragement to embrace God's love for us. He promises that one day, the darkness will disappear and we will all dwell in eternal light and happiness!
