A reading from the Prophet Isaiah

Is 42: 1 - 4. 6 - 7

that she has received from the hand of the Lord
double punishment for all her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord.

let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley;
then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind

COMMENTARY

Jesus' Baptism is Ours

What did it mean for Jesus to come up out of the waters of the Jordan to experience the special presence of the Holy Spirit as though it were a dove, gently hovering over him? As a Jew, he would have been reminded both of the Divine Wind hovering over the void-become-creation, and of the dove bearing an olive twig as God restored humanity's life on earth after the Flood. The Holy Spirit was empowering Him for a re-creative role on behalf of humanity.

His second experience was to sense God's delight and joy sounding, reverberating through every fibre of his body, every reach of his soul: 'You are my beloved Son, my favour rests on you.'

Any baby, any adolescent, any adult who is baptised shares in these wonderful experiences. The dynamic power of the Holy Spirit hovers over the person as a gentle presence, preparing the one baptised for a mission on behalf of humanity. And every baptised person senses, below the range of hearing, the echo of the same marvellous words: "You are my beloved son or daughter, my favour rests on you."

Is it any wonder that Our Lord adopted this water rite to incorporate his followers into such wonderful experiences as a power-full impetus to fulfil their mission to cooperate in God's saving plan for humanity?

We could take a moment to pray in gratitude for the parent/s or other person/s who brought us into this tradition stretching over almost two millennia. May they be filled with all that flows from their being beloved sons and daughters of God.

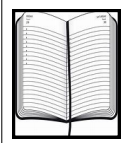

The Sacrament of Marriage

Last year I was fortunate enough to attend my first Bible Camp/ Young Adults Retreat where we looked at the sacrament of marriage- what it means for us as Catholics, what did God intend for marriage, and does marriage really matter? The Augustine Institute program BELOVED provided deep and spiritual answers to these questions.

Marriage can appear daunting to many, and with the way society promotes an almost egocentric mindset of 'how can I benefit from this relationship?', lifelong commitment, self-donation and the simple act of loving each other wholeheartedly all seem difficult concepts to grasp. However, we know these can be possible through the gift of God's grace- after all, we have been created with an innate desire for profound, genuine love (including marital) and this yearning can only be exemplified if we are to love totally, freely and faithfully- just as Jesus did with his church and his people. Therefore, when the husband and wife become a physical sign of God's grace, and a sacramental bond is formed between not just the two, but also Jesus himself.

Of course, marriage will come with its challenges- it involves accepting and working through each other's weaknesses and imperfections as they are brought into the relationship (which can also be referred to as sanctification of the spouse), but we can overcome these obstacles because God is with us and He is also one of the many reasons why the two should put in effort to resolve issues together. When the two enter into marriage the new relationship that is formed should be fruitful (both should be open to the possibility of having children), exclusive (solely between husband and wife) and indissoluble (cementing the same permanency and commitment Jesus has with the church). It sounds like a lot, but that is the beauty of marriage- it is truly a gift and blessing from God, one which allows us to love as deeply and selflessly as He does for us. Although all this might not seem so relevant right now, it's a gentle reminder for the true meaning of marriage and what God's plan for this sacramental union is- it's a lifelong journey inclusive of love which is fruitful, free, total and faithful that paves the way for Jesus and true happiness.
