

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy Dt 26: 4 - 10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God!

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Luke Lk 4: 1 - 13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says:

You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says:

He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you,

and again:

They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said:

You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.

COMMENTARY

Temptations

After his baptism Jesus was driven by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness where the devil put him to the test. Jesus was offered three shortcuts to his living in harmony with the will of his Heavenly Father.

First, when *he* was hungry there would be bread out of stones.

Second, when he wanted to change the world he could have absolute political power.

Third, when he needed to take risks, angels would keep him safe.

Our baptism does not insulate us from the same threefold pattern of temptation. Do you find yourself saying:

I want the whole world to change to satisfy me, or

I want to exercise power over others, *or* I want to take stupid risks and come out unharmed, or all three!

What must we do when such temptations assail us? Realise that such temptations are much less powerful than they seem - the last gasp of the vanquished devil. Imitate Jesus in going to the Scriptures, preferably the Gospels, in order to have the words to hurl back at the devil as you are tested.

We could pause to make a Lenten resolution to read a Gospel, and to do so confident of our Baptismal identity as beloved daughters and sons of God.

They say that time seems to fly by faster as we grow older. If we consider that with each passing year, one year (being 365 days roughly) begins to constitute an ever smaller percentage of your entire life, it makes sense. A whole year feels a lot longer to a 5 year old (that's almost a quarter of his whole life!) then it does to a 50 year old.



When seen in this manner we begin to understand how our perception of time changes as we tick off more calendar years. With each passing year, the big events in our liturgical year seem to come around again sooner than we can blink! We are once again in our Lenten period which began on 2nd March, Ash Wednesday and will continue until 14th April. Sometimes people can approach Lent with a bit of apprehension due to thoughts like "Oh no...what will I give up this year?", "Is it enough?" "I wonder what other people are giving up theirs seems harder than mine", "I gave up the same thing last – will God be displeased?".

To give up something for Lent is to sacrifice something of value to you. But it doesn't just end with refraining from eating a food, giving up time or engaging in a certain activity like extra prayer time. Every time you say no to eating your favourite food, or you stop yourself from hitting the snooze button or whatever it may be, call to mind why we are doing this. This is the season for us to repent, ask God for forgiveness and reflect on our relationship with him. Prayer, fasting and performing works of love are the pillars of Lent. In giving up something or doing a little extra in His name, we offer up this personal sacrifice to him as an intentional action to him. That is why what one person's sacrifices for Lent will differ from anothers, because each person values things differently. In this Lenten season let us take the chance to stop, reflect, and pick a sacrifice meaningful to us to give to the Lord.

As Lent calls for a time of reflection, consider praying for the people of Ukraine, even if its something simple like for their safety and protection. If you want a bit more guidance you can use this prayer (from Archbishop Peter Comensoli)

Gracious God,

We pray for the people of Ukraine suffering from war. May they be held in your loving care and protection and given the strength to endure their suffering and hardship.

Transform the hearts and minds of those who perpetuate the violence and oppression.

Grant wisdom to world leaders in advancing efforts toward peace; may they not be compromised by self-interest and blind indifference.

We ask all this through the intercession of Our Lady of Perpetual Help and in the name of your Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, now and forever.
