A reading from the book of Genesis

Gen 18: 20 - 32

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? 
A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Luke

Lk 11: 1 - 13

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come;
give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. 'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

COMMENTARY

Heaven and Earth can coincide

People often imagine huge distance between Earth and a Heaven beyond the horizon of the universe. But Jesus Christ taught us to pray 'Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.'

How can this come about? Jesus identified two areas on which we need to focus to help make Heaven and Earth share the same space.

'Give us this day our daily bread.' This petition is very real for most inhabitants of the world – a plea for the necessities of life to stave off real hunger. If we respond to this plea, we can change a Hellish situation to a place where Heaven and Earth coincide.

'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' But, first to Shakespeare: 'The quality of Mercy is not strained. It falleth as the gentle rain of Heaven on to the place beneath.'

If we develop a hardness of heart which refuses to show forgiveness, then we are like earth concreted over and are unable to absorb God's forgiveness into our own lives. When we forgive someone, we become more able to absorb the gentle rain of heavenly mercy and forgiveness.

So, Heaven and Earth need not be as distant as supposed. Our Lord has shown us how we can help make these dimensions of existence coincide.

We could take a moment to resolve to pray the 'Our Father' by our lives, helping to provide evidence for our acclamation:

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Thanks Giving Prayer.

"Thank you for your amazing power

and work in our lives,

thank you for your goodness

and for your blessings over us.

Thank you that you are able to bring hope

through even the toughest of times,

strengthening us for your purposes.

Thank you for your great love and care.

Thank you for your mercy and grace.

Thank you that you are always with us and will never leave us.

Thank you for your incredible sacrifice so

that we might have freedom and life.

Forgive us for when we don't thank you

enough, for who you are, for all that you do,

for all that you've given.

Help us to set our eyes and

our hearts on you afresh.

Renew our spirits,

fill us with your peace and joy.

We love you and we need you,

this day and every day.

We give you praise and thanks,

for You alone are worthy!



Youth Camp 2022- Mission Impossible

Earlier this month, the youth at St Monica's attended the long-awaited camp which had been in the making for 2 years! The theme was Mission Impossible, with reference to some of the challenging or difficult situations we as Catholics may encounter in today's secular world which might be considered 'impossible' to overcome. Specifically, across the four days we touched on the problems with materialism and social media such as creating a false perception of what 'success' means. Our modern society champions capitalism, the need to earn more money, accumulate more items or hopping onto the latest trend- all of which push us away from God and can even lead to sinful thoughts or emotions including jealousy or desire for another's possessions or lifestyle. Achieving monetary success should not be your primary purpose in life (after all, we cannot take this with us when we pass)- rather, striving for spiritual fulfilment and a healthy relationship with God by choosing to live humbly just like Jesus did is something which is eternal and everlasting, so why not invest in this instead?

We also discussed the importance of friendships, and ways in which we can handle discussing controversial topics with non-Catholic or atheist peers- here, the youth considered what are some of the core values/ideals that are central to their own friendships, and how do they tend to resolve conflict. Delving deeper into the theological side of our faith, the concept of the human body as being a divine and spiritual part of God's creation was an interesting way of thinking about our physical selves. Because we are tainted with original sin, we are thus always susceptible to temptation and the possibility that we will sin again- and our bodies are a tangible, physical reflection of our internal soul and the grace God gives us. Pope John Paul II gave a series of 129 lectures, compiled together to create the Theology of the Body, in a way which helps us to better understand the mystery, dignity and beauty of our body and how we should treat it. Lastly, we rounded off camp with a session on how we can deal with stress and anxiety in our daily lives, considering its universality. Using examples across both the Old and New Testament whereby individuals such as Elijah, Moses and even Jesus himself experienced these emotions, we come to understand that God is the one constant throughout each of these distressing situations. Relieving stress through prayer and meditation and trusting in God's plan for you despite how challenging the obstacle may be were some of the key themes central to this session.

This provides just a brief summary into the topics we covered in this year's youth camp. Throughout the four days we were also given many opportunities to praise and worship the Lord, put on our thinking caps for trivia, as well as have a bit of a laugh during games night and amazing race. All of this would not have been possible without any of the youth who chose to come to the camp (so thank you! 😊) as well as all the leaders who have worked tirelessly to put everything together. We hope to see you again next year!
