

COMMENTARY

Lowly Prince of Peace

Jesus entered Jerusalem, not as a warrior in the tradition of King David as many had hoped for, but riding simply on a donkey. The disciples and the crowd applauded him, but they proved fickle in their support.

On the other hand, Jesus remained steadfast in his commitment to non-violent revolutionary change of the religious and political systems so as to establish the reign of God. Why did he renounce marshalling human and angelic warriors to further his cause?

First, Jesus embodied God-for-us, and God does not want the destruction of those he has created out of love. Second, Jesus had a premonition that an armed revolt would lead to the destruction of Jerusalem and the dispersal of the Jewish people (as occurred in 70AD).

Third, another Gospel (Luke) recounts that as Jesus laboured up Mount Calvary he turned to some wailing women and said, 'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, weep rather for yourselves and for your children.' He knew that they suffer grievously in armed uprising. This is seen in barbaric reality in our own time with women being tortured and raped in campaigns of terror, trafficked into sexual slavery, suffering the loss of sons, husband and lovers.

We could take a moment to pray that the Church of the 21st century, successor of the pacifist Church of the first three centuries, may enter on a new period of reflection on these issues, grappling with the desire to protect the innocent, yet always challenged by the man on a donkey, Divine Prince of Peace.

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Prayer for Palm Sunday

Merciful God,
as we enter Holy week,
turn our hearts again to Jerusalem,
and to the life, death,
and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
Stir up within us the gift of faith
that we may not only
praise him with our lips,
but may follow him in the way of the cross.

Increase the faith of those who place their hope in you, and graciously hear the prayers of those who call on you, O God, that we, who today hold high these branches in our minds and hearts to hail Christ in his triumph, may bear fruit for you by good works accomplished in him. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

SOAP Reflection 2nd April 2023

Scripture- Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, where we once again encounter a series of events- the betrayal of Judas; the Last Supper; Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane; Peter's denial of Jesus and the accusation and sentence of Jesus which would lead to his ultimate death. It is the start of Holy Week, and the chance for us to reflect on the mystery of God's love for mankind, embodied in one man's sacrifice.

Observation- Upon reading this lengthy passage, there is much to be noted. Overall, I think the Lord's Passion is a time of reflection and meditation on how strong our faith is, and what our relationship is like with Jesus. Are we like the apostles sometimes, where we feel certain that we will not shy away from God, yet when faced with uncertain situations where our faith is challenged, we deny Jesus the same way Peter did? Are we steadfast in our prayer, even in moments where we feel distant from God? I can almost imagine the distress and realization Jesus experienced when he was praying to his Father- He knew he was yet to experience the worst suffering known to man but he sought comfort and reassurance in prayer (39: "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will.") How readily is Jesus able to lay his life down for us, yet the disciples failed to recognize that the time was now.

Application- As we approach Holy Week, take some time during your day to simply be present with God- give him your time. Reflect on the past 40 days- what did you give up? Why? In moments where you felt tempted to do something, did you act on it? Were you sensitive to the movements of your heart? Are we strong in our faith, and appreciative of the greatest sacrifice Jesus has done for us? How can we strengthen or rebuild our relationship with Christ? Contemplate on the events leading up to Jesus' death on the cross, and pray for wisdom to better understand them.

Prayer- Dear Lord, we thank you for showing us your unconditional love and mercy. Please open my heart to you, that I will welcome you into all areas of my life. Give me the strength to stand up for you and my faith when times where I experience opposition, but also in moments where I experience great uncertainty for the future. Help me to trust in your plan, and to approach each new day as an opportunity to serve you. Amen.
