## FIRST READING

## A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 8: 5 - 8. 14 - 17

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. ## **Parallel Truths**

Today's Gospel speaks of an advocate. This translates a Greek word: 'paraclete'. Our Lord says: 'I will send you another Paraclete to be with you forever.' Our Lord was a Paraclete, and he would send another.

What does this strange sounding word mean? Here is a hint. We all know that parallel lines run, well, para-llel. They run alongside each other. A paraclete is a person who stands alongside someone and pleads their case.

That is how our Lord Jesus Christ saw himself. His role was not to condemn but to plead the case for mercy and compassion, to be the intercessor *par excellence*.

Our Lord promises another Paraclete dwelling within us, individually and as the body of Christ's disciples, the Holy Spirit advocating our cause, assisting us to live Truth-fully by the measure of the One who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. This Paraclete particularly assists us by acting as the Spirit of Truth.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the two Paracletes, constantly pleading our case before the Throne of Mercy.

### SOAP Reflection 14th May 2023

Scripture: - "If you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of Truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him or knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Before long, the world will not see me anymore, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father, and you are in me, and I am in you. Whoever has my commands and keeps them is the one who loves me. The one who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show myself to them"

Observation- In this week's gospel, Jesus promises us the gift of the Holy Spirit. Through this promise, we are able to see Jesus' love and his providence for us. He assures us that he "will not leave you (us) as orphans" but that he will be with us in our souls and guiding us towards holiness. In a world full of materialism, self-gratification and twisted ideals, it is easy to see how true Jesus' words, "the world will not see me anymore" is. However, as Catholics, we are called to see Jesus- to listen to him and follow him. As such, we should learn to cut out notions that society often now deems "normal" or "acceptable" and to show our love to our heavenly father by keeping his com-

Application: In the coming week, let us be reminded of the words from today's gospel- that God has left us with the gift of the Holy Spirit to guide us in our daily lives. Even though we cannot see Jesus with our eyes and hear him with our ears, may we remember to take time out of our busy week to listen to him and feel him in our hearts through the Holy Spirit. May we actively seek to listen to the Holy Spirit when we live out our lives this week in order to keep God's commandments especially in times where our conscience may be challenged. Let us also remember that Jesus is in every one of us and let us see God's mercy and grace in the face of everyone we meet because it is through this that we are able to keep the greatest commandment – to love our neighbour as we love ourselves.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank you for your gift of the Holy Spirit. May you continue to keep the Holy Spirit burning bright in our hearts. Please grant us the strength to overcome temptation so that we can live out a life of holiness according to your commandments. I pray that we will always seek to find your face in each other, to treat one another with the same mercy and grace that you provided us.
