ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 2: 1 - 11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit

we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink. This is the word of the Lord

COMMENTARY

The Bush Fire of Pentecost

summer progresses in Australia, invariably great bushfires break out. Those who report the infernos speak not only of the flames, but often of a mighty roar like a great windstorm heralding the approaching fire.

The earth had quaked at the death of Jesus, but death had been conquered and the earth was supercharged with divine energy and vitality. Into all this the Risen Lord sent his Holy Spirit like a lightning strike. Divine energy was unleashed and St Luke portrays this particular event in our bushfire terms. The Holy Spirit, he says, was 'like tongues of fire' and 'like the sound of a mighty wind' accompanying the descent of the Holy Spirit on a gathering of a fearful group of followers of Our Lord.

The tangled undergrowth of fear, anxiety and timidity was cleared away. The new life of the church was germinated, took root and has been growing ever since, listening to the core message preached by St Peter: Jesus of Nazareth had conquered death and Peter and others were witnesses to the Risen Lord.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the successor of St Peter that he may preach the resurrection in a way which is understandable by people of every culture, every ethnicity, every language group around the world.

SOAP Reflection 28th May

Scripture- In today's Pentecost Sunday gospel, Jesus' statement "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I send you," stood out to me the most as he gives his disciples the power of the Holy Spirit to go out and continue His mission

Observation- Although a short passage, it clearly demonstrates that Jesus has resurrected. Because He is no longer physically able to spread the word of God, He grants the Twelve the ability to do so. Through his divine nature he 'breathes' the Holy Spirit upon them so that they can carry out His work, glorify the Father; teach others what Jesus had preached to them and to bear witnesses to the Kingdom of God. Jesus gives them a greater power, one with a deeper meaning, rather than just authority over others and greed for material, earthly desires which previously dominated the many Kings before. Similarly, we have been granted the gift of the Holy Spirit through our sacraments such as baptism and confirmation. Through baptism, we are washed away of our original sin and in confirmation we make a public declaration of our faith and trust in the Lord. Despite reaching these milestones, we are still susceptible to sin and temptation, which is why we invoke the Holy Spirit to intercede for us and give us the strength to live more holy, Christ-like lives.

Application- In this coming week, may I be more aware and present of the movements of my heart, and the interactions I have with others. When am I experiencing anger, frustration, sadness, resentment or any type of emotion which pulls me away from God? Take a moment to recognize these feelings, and welcome the Holy Spirit into your heart. Say a small prayer; give thanks to the Lord for the gift that he so freely gave to us which has given us the chance to be able to love Him, and others too. In our conversations with people, especially non-believers, consider whether God may be presenting this opportunity for you to let them know of His presence and extend an invitation to church, scripture reading or prayer together.

Prayer- Dear Lord, we commemorate this day as Pentecost, where we celebrate the birth of your church and the continuation of your mission. May we be reminded of our role as a disciple in spreading your word to others, as well as being an active member of our church community so that we may build and strengthen the faith of those who are spiritually weak and distant. Pray that the Holy Spirit may come upon my loved ones, the sick and suffering, all Catholics and non-believers- that they may all experience the power and love of Christ in their lives and continually seek ways to live faithful, Holy lives. Amen.
