

SECOND READING

The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St John Jn 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give

is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven: not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

The Maternal Jesus

I once saw a young mother discreetly breastfeeding her baby during Mass, and thought ... 'What a wonderful thing!' There could not be a better illustration, a better acting out of what Jesus says in today's Gospel: 'The one who eats me will live.'

Of course, even mothers who find they cannot breastfeed offer the same gift for nine months as the baby draws its life from the mother's body in the womb.

This is a good analogy for what Our Lord was teaching in today's Gospel.

'Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me and I in them.' Notice the very maternal language. The risen Lord truly abides in us, we truly abide in the risen Lord. This is as intimate as the baby dwelling in the womb of its mother.

Moreover, it is a Holy communion which is both a present reality and a foretaste and promise about our place in God's future: 'The one who eats this bread will live forever.'

We could pause for a moment to pray with St Thomas Aquinas: 'Oh Sacred Banquet in which Christ is received *and* a pledge of future glory is given to us.'

SOAP reflection 11th June

Scripture: Jesus said to them (the Jewish crowd), '...I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.

Observation: In today's gospel, it is evident that Jesus caused controversy with His teachings, particularly since many Jewish people consider His teachings to be unorthodox. Jesus makes a bold claim that anyone who drinks His blood and eats His flesh will have the promise of eternal life, and that people who consume His body and eats His flesh 'consume' His spirit and invite the spirit of God to abide within them. Despite the scepticism that the Jewish audience shows, Jesus appears to be unfazed and reiterates the promise of eternal life for those who consume His body and blood. It is through vignettes like these that Jesus reveals His mission and purpose. This story shows that one of Jesus' missions is to establish the sacrament of communion, which is fulfilled through the Last Supper.

Application: Because Jesus fulfilled His mission to atone for our sins and give us a path to salvation, we as Catholics respond to that mission. Jesus invites us to participate in the Eucharist through the consumption of his body and blood. Why is the Eucharist important to Catholics? As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist is a sacrament, an outward expression of an inward reception of grace. When we consume the Eucharist, we are receiving sanctifying grace. Receiving sanctifying grace makes us deserving of salvation and brings us to a state of holiness. Without it, our state of original sin and our tendency to sin would prevent us from being deserving of eternal life. Although it can be easy to simply go through the motions during mass and participate in the Eucharist while thinking about something else, this wouldn't be giving the Eucharist the attention and respect that it deserves. We aren't actively responding to Jesus' invitation to accept the graces that He offers if we are distracted or lukewarm in the way we participate in the Eucharist. To become more actively responsive, let us not only welcome Jesus into our hearts when we receive the Eucharist, but also reflect on whether we are truly changed, better humans who have manifested Jesus' grace and power in our dispositions, habits, thoughts, behaviour and interactions with other people.

Prayer: Lord, Father all-powerful, and ever-living God, I thank you, for even though I am a sinner, your unprofitable servant, not because of my worth, but in the kindness of your mercy, you have fed me with the precious Body and Blood of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that this holy communion may not bring me condemnation and punishment but forgiveness and salvation. May it be a helmet of faith and a shield of good will. May it purify me from evil ways and put an end to my evil passions. May it bring me charity and patience, humility and obedience, and growth in power to do good.
