A burning rubbish tip in Jerusalem (Gehenna) provided Jesus with one image of Hell. Here is John Henry Newman's image.

Have you travelled to a foreign country and can't speak the language? There is lots of weeping and gnashing of teeth.

What if you were born with a good ear for languages, but had deliberately never learnt the language of that other place? You would only have yourself to blame. It would be a living hell.

That is what happens at death. The soul is suddenly transported to a different dimension of existence, and it can be either heavenly or hellish depending on the choices and actions of a lifetime.

So, our lifetime project is to 'learn the language of heaven'. We can mainly do this by following the story of Jesus, the Word of God, the perfect conversation between humanity and God.

We could pause for a moment to move from incommunicado to communion by learning and practising the language of Heaven.

SOAP Reflection 30th July

Scripture- Matthew 13:44-52

Observation - In this week's Gospel, there are three parables to reflect on. The first two parables: the parables of the Hidden Treasure and the Pearl, urges us to consider the Kingdom of God as a fine treasure in which one must constantly seek to find and must commit all their possessions in order to obtain this treasure. These parables illustrate that while there is struggle and difficulty in seeking out and following the path towards Heaven, the reward we receive greatly surpasses the obstacles we may face and any earthly desires we may hold. The third parable provides a further explanation to the image of Heaven. The time will come where at the end of the age before the second coming of Christ, judgement will befall on all and those who have rejected God will be separated from those who have placed their faith in Him. This becomes a message to us to remain faithful to Him and also encourages us to bring more closer to realising His love for us. Within this parable, God's perspective is also revealed to us, and therefore when we consider the first two stories from His perspective, we are made known to a deeper meaning of hope and unending love and compassion. God is also working in a field and will sell everything to get that treasure. God looks for valuable pearls, and He sells everything to get that pearl. In the same way, God has given us all an opportunity to meet Him in heaven by sacrificing His Son.

Application - As I reflected on this week's Gospel reading, I am particularly drawn to two messages. The first being that our relationship with God should be viewed alike to how men sought to find treasure in a field or merchant finding a fine pearl; it should be seen as precious and of the highest priority. There is a collective struggle for all believers to follow Christ as we live in a world that urges us towards individualism and self-centred wishes. Thus, we must be active in our faith and make sustained efforts to nurture our relationship with God. This can be in the form of prayer (which come in various forms!), bible study or individual reading. Anything that connects us and enables us to learn more about the Lord can help protect our relationship with Him. Secondly, while there is conflict to conform with societal norms and its materialistic rewards, I have found comfort in the second message of hope. God will sacrifice everything to meet us in His Kingdom so we should have hope! While we are in this battle against sin on Earth, we are reassured that as we continue to set God as our guide, the treasure we seek out, our reward will be great in heaven. And until that day comes, may we all hold a hopeful heart, repent and turn to God for grace and guidance.

Prayer - Dear Heavenly Father, I thank you for the guidance and hope you have given us today. Let us be strengthened by the Holy Spirit to put aside our materialistic temptations and desires, and be renewed in faith to seek You fully. May we be compelled to also seek to bring more closer towards You in every person that we meet through our actions and words. May we reflect the kindness and compassion You have shown to us in every encounter so that many more can obtain the precious reward of heaven. Amen. - Rebecca
