 Transfigured Bodysouls We have to get rid of the idea that the soul is a dot of energy in some hidden core of our body. In fact, the body is in the soul. There is no part of my body which is not immersed in my soul. It is my whole person, bodysoul, which needs to be saved. As Thomas Aquinas says: 'If only my soul is saved, I am not saved.' Today's Gospel does not portray an out-ofbody experience of religious ecstasy. Jesus' body was translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. Further, this transfiguration was not a solitary experience for Jesus. Peter, James and John witnessed it precisely because it told them what our Heavenly Father desired as their destiny beyond martyrdom, if only they would listen to Jesus. Heavenly salvation will involve my whole person, bodysoul, being transformed. But could a person, during their earthly existence, share in the transfiguration experience of Christ? SOAP Reflection 6th August

Scripture- This week we see the Jesus with his disciples go up a mountain. But it's not the mountain itself that is important, but more what happens on the mountain. As we see them reach the top, Jesus transfigures and emanates a bright glowing light from his face, and his clothes shine a blinding white. In a sense, there an aspect of wonder as He rises, with Moses and Elijah to appear next to him to converse. Fearful and in awe of what is happening, the disciples offer to make housing for Jesus and the strangers that appear to him. Mid-sentence, the heavens opens and a voice appears speaking to the disciples, frightening them into a position of prostration, with their heads to the ground, confirming Jesus and to continue to head his word. Further words of comfort are then provided to his disciples to not fear the voice from above, but also not to share the world of the Lord just yet until after Jesus' resurrection.

Observation- We enter this week coming upon a gospel passage that is not only referenced in the gospel of Matthew, but also mentioned in Luke 9:28-36. Jesus' transfiguration can be seen as a key moment in Jesus' life and ministry, often compared to in importance as events such as his baptism, resurrection and ascension. Here we also see a cloud forming over the group, understood to be God, as he is often depicted as a large following cloud such as in Exodus as he watched over Moses. Seeing what would be a miracle to the disciples, we observe the transfiguration from their point of view, unable to hear the conversation between Jesus, Moses and Elijah, but only the booming voice of God encouraging our continued following of God.

Application -It is difficult to truly understand what is happening here in this week's gospel as this is an example of a test of one's faith which differs from person to person. In some way, we understand as much as the disciples Peter, James and John did in the moment. Upon seeing Jesus' rise, with two grand figures who we know understand to be Moses and Elijah in a blinding light, as well as the booming voice of God from the clouds, it is a true testament and confirmation of all that the believe and follow Jesus, actualised before their eyes. In today's society, we wait for the second coming of Jesus, and today's gospel somewhat prepares us for this aspect and to show us different ways our faith will one day actualise before ourselves. We take this a reminder to strengthen our faith in anticipation of his passion

Prayer- Lord, we pray that we thank you for the mysteries of faith. May your wonders be truly boundless and work in time. As we wait for your return, we pray that you may give us the virtue of patience and to strengthen our faith to also once again experience your passion. We ask that you also give us guidance throughout this week so that in the actions we take, we grow closer to you. Amen
