COMMENTARY

Keep Rowing!

The disciples had started off from the Jewish side of the Sea of Galilee, familiar territory. Jesus guided them through the stormy situation to 'the other side', the pagan side, unfamiliar territory where they would not have felt at home.

Buffeted by storms, the Church is in the midst of a journey from familiar to unfamiliar territory.

Some of the storms include a new attitude to authority, to gender roles. There is anger and suspicion at sexual abuse and its cover up. Many of our contemporaries are openly hostile or contentedly indifferent.

In all these situations and many more, Our Lord will not allow us the indulgence of nostalgic yearning for the safety of the past country inhabited by the Church. We are not to throw Tradition with a capital 'T' overboard. To jettison the spirit-led experience of the Church over two millennia will not help us. Discerning tradition from nostalgia, we must make our way to the other shore.

We could pause for a moment, resolving to row with courage because we know we are in the same boat as Peter whom our Risen Lord assures:

'Do not be afraid.'

SOAP Reflection 13th August

Scripture- Matthew 14:22-33, specifically when Peter doubts Jesus and says, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.

Observation- From this passage, Peter's dubiety stood out to me the most because I realized that I too can be hesitant about my faith and even Jesus' existence. Peter's reaction is not unjustified- after all, experiencing uncertainty and fear about being able to walk on water is a humanely reasonable response yet despite this, Jesus encourages him to step forward as if He knows Peter would not sink in the raging waters. With this reassurance, Peter begins to "walk on the water towards Jesus," but quickly becomes frightened when he notices how strong the wind is. As Matthew records, Jesus "immediately" reaches out and grabs Peter- rather than rebuking him, he asks gently, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" This question can also be directed towards myself, as I wonder in moments where I may become enveloped in challenges and daily life that I lose sight of Jesus' love and providence, and like Peter I cry out "Lord save me!" because I need Him; yet there would be no need for such desperation if I had full trust and faith in Jesus.

Application- This passage can allow us to reflect on our own faith, and whether we truly believe in Jesus or the teachings of the Catholic Church. It is only after Jesus saves Peter that the wind dies down and the other disciples realize that "Truly [He] is the son of God." Do we need the Lord to give us 'evidence' or proof of his existence? How often does our faith waver? Do we only reach out to Jesus when we are in danger or desperationsimply put, do we deny Jesus in occasions where we don't need Him? Although we may never encounter such a severe situation like Peter whereby the Lord directly intervenes and calms a storm for us, it is important to note that when we do experience fear or uncertainty, we can trust that the Lord will save and provide. It may not be immediate, but that should not change how much faith we have in Jesus.

Prayer- Dear Heavenly Father, you give us peace and calmness in our hearts and minds because you love, care, and provide deeply, especially during times of struggles. Help me to realize this, and truly believe in your providence and your word. It is through such experiences that we may grow closer to you Lord, and strengthen our faith. Help me to notice when my faith is lacking, or my trust in you is weak, and bring me back to you. Help me to live through your grace and faith, and not just through sight. Amen.
