COMMENTARY

On Catholic Dogs

A pagan woman approaches a Jewish man and she begs Jesus to heal her daughter.

Jesus gives a dismissive answer to the woman: 'It is not fair to take the children's bread and throw it to the house dogs.' The children are obviously the Jewish people.

This remarkable pagan woman stands her ground and engages in a verbal joust with Jesus! She argues: 'Yes, Lord, but even the house dogs get the crumbs that fall from their master's table.'

Jesus recognises *her* faith and the daughter was healed. This story was put in the Gospels to show how Jesus extended his saving mission to non-Jews in Pagan territory.

That is Good News for billions of non-Jewish people over the course of history since then and into the future. That is why we are truly 'Catholic', which, as you know, is the Greek for 'world-wide'.

We could pause for a moment to celebrate this Canaanite woman as the first 'Catholic'!

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SOAP Reflection 20th August

Scripture- today's scripture comes from the book of Matthew, specifically Matthew 15: 21-28. Put briefly, it recounts an encounter Jesus has with a Canaanite woman begging him to help her daughter who was troubled by the devil. Though he initially says nothing, and though his disciples beg him to send her away, the woman persists. As a result, though a Canaanite, Jesus acknowledges her faith and cured her daughter.

Observation- Something I observed that seemed quite interesting to me was that Jesus seemingly ignores her in the beginning. At first, I was somewhat perplexed. Why would Jesus, the epitome of love and compassion, ignore a woman so obviously in need of help?

If you consider it a bit more, it becomes apparent that while Jesus does at first say nothing, it isn't out of irritation, but rather he seems to be gauging her. Even when the disciples try to get him to rebuff her, he merely explains that he was only sent to save the those lost descendants of the House of Israel. In this way, rather than sending her away, he seeming gives her a chance to explain herself, and in doing so, she is able to prove her faith. She kneels before him, and kneeling while obviously a sign of fealty, is also an acknowledgement that she recognises Jesus as who he truly is – it is something that has been echoed by many others in the Gospel.

Application- While there is a lot more that can probably be analysed, the important thing to take away from this Gospel is that salvation is not just limited to the house of David, but rather, to those who display true faith. And therefore, while it is so easy to just ignore those who do not believe in God, under the pretext that there is no point helping them, it is important to remember that this is not necessarily the case. It is precisely because of faith being the key to salvation that as Catholics we have a duty to also give others a chance at it, and to spread the word as far as we can, even through the simplest things in our daily lives.

Prayer- Today, while reading this Gospel, I pray that we can be reminded that God's love and hope for us extends past those who are Catholic and to those who do not currently have a place for him in their hearts. May we have the courage to go towards them and reach out a helping hand — a hand free of judgement, and full of care. I pray that all those currently lost find their way towards you in the hopes that they too can experience your salvation. Amen.
