A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 5:1-7

In the Hebrew scripture, Israel is spoken of as the Vineyard of God. We can say that now the Church is the vineyard of God. God is the Landlord, we are the tenants. World Youth Day Reflections

Although it has been over some time since coming back from my first ever overseas trip and where I was privileged to attend my first World Youth Day pilgrimage, I still can't forget the wonderful times I spent overlooking beautiful sites and visiting different places during those weeks.

I experienced a range of emotions throughout the trip, especially since it was my first significant trip, like my first time ever flying, but visiting Barcelona and Portugal and the trips in between to see all the cathedrals was an incredible experience. However, I had no idea what I was getting myself into before the trip began, particularly in light of the WYD events.

As the others have stated, during the entire week of WYD we only got to attend a few talks and exhibitions due to the sheer amount of pilgrims exceeding the capacity of the event locations.

As we got more and more frustrated that we couldn't attend most talks and sessions I think it taught me that even if we plan everything out we still have bumpy roads along the way and we don't expect what is to come next, but despite that, we got to meet people that came from all around the world and got to see so many young Catholics from around the world gathering during the first mass and the final mass that it felt like a place of belonging. Through the scorching heat to get to the place where the final Mass was being held all we could see was thousands of pilgrims and finding out that about 1.5 million pilgrims attended the final Mass was mind boggling.

But the most important part for me was the speech from Pope Francis during adoration as it really meant a lot to me and just has stuck with me ever since coming back from the trip. The Pope said to always think back to what the pope has said for us young people 'to go in haste as Mary went with haste and I always think back to this.
