COMMENTARY

True Perspectives

Did you notice that Our Lord does not command us to love 'God'? No, we are to love 'the Lord your God', the One who rescued the Jewish people from slavery. The resurrection of Jesus Christ reveals the Lord God as the liberator from the apparent final dominance of death. Loving such a liberator is the natural response. So, 'Love the Lord your God'.

Then Our Lord does not command us to love our neighbour! Rather, 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' But who is 'yourself'? In the wonderful storytelling of Genesis, we are told that Adam, an earthen statue, had Divine Breath breathed into the nostrils, creating him as a human being. We earthlings are conceived with the Divine Breath at the core of our being.

The challenge for you and for me is to see 'yourself' in that way, and thereafter every human being whose lives we can affect: the neighbour. And in today's global world, the neighbour can be a person in a society geographically or culturally distant.

We could pause for a moment to see the true dimensions of God, self and the other, to more easily fulfil the dual command.

May she help us to remain in the light of this face that shines upon us, in order to rediscover all the tenderness of God the Father; may it be she who supports us in invoking the Holy Spirit, so that he will renew the face of the earth and transform hearts, dissolving their hardness in the face of the goodness of disarming Child who was born for us. May the Mother of accompany us; may she obtain for us and for the whole world the desired gift of peace.

Youth Corner 29th October

Scripture- The line which stood out to me the most was Jesus' firm response to the Pharisees: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment."

Observation- From this passage, we can see the Pharisees are testing Jesus, wanting to humiliate and question him in front of the people. It is considered a 'test' because they all know the standard answer which comes with the question 'What is the greatest commandment?'. In Deuteronomy, this is reinforced in Chapter 6, verse 4-5 "Hear O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." However, what surprises the Pharisees is Jesus' continuation that you must also "Love your neighbour as yourself." Together, Jesus says, they are the most important commandments which everything else depends upon. Without love not just for our creator, but also for one another, nothing will work. Both these actions are comparable, and are considered equally as great and important as each other.

Application- Although it sounds quite straightforward to follow these two main commandments, it can also be difficult to be consistent. In our busy schedules and daily life, we can forget to work on our relationship with God, forgetting to pray, read the Bible or even thinking about the current state of your faith. We may tend to focus more on the second commandment-loving others, building your relationships with them or helping the community. However, Jesus tells us we must attend to both commandments! We cannot prioritize one over the other simply because we think it is easier, or suits us better. Growing in both simultaneously can have complementary benefits- for example, praying and talking to God might encourage you and fill you with the faith and courage needed to help others who are less fortunate than us. You simply just need that push from God.

Prayer- Dear Heavenly Father, we thank you for giving us the ten commandments, and emphasizing the importance of firstly loving you, and secondly, loving those people around us. Thank you teaching us how to love- we can only do this because you were the first to experience it, and you gave us this gift. Let us use it in our words and actions, singing your praises and being a servant to others. Amen
