GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jn 1:6-8. 19-28

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:


> a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you - the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

COMMENTARY

Witness to the Light

St John's Gospel never calls John, 'the Baptist'. No, he is John the Witness: 'a witness to speak for the Light'. We discover in this Gospel that this light is embodied in Jesus Christ, most graphically portrayed in the Transfiguration when Christ's body is radiant, translucent, with Divine Light.

Jesus Christ is the light of the world, the One who came to liberate human beings from the many dark captivities which imprison them, the One who vanguished the inky blackness of the tomb.

We can become partakers in the life of this Divine Light. At baptism, this is symbolised by the lighting of a small candle from the great Easter candle which is sung into the church on the Easter Vigil as 'Christ our Light', the Conqueror of Death.

As a baptised people our allegiance to 'The Light' is not to be a private matter between 'me and God'. No. like John, we must bear witness to 'The Light' by being instruments of His power to dispel the darkness which can enshroud people's lives.

We could pause for a moment to commit ourselves to fulfil the promise of our baptismal candle so that we might more authentically celebrate the birth of the 9:15am (English Mass) Divine Light come into human history.

SOAP Reflection 17th December

Scripture: This week, we meet John, who will play out his role to identify Jesus as the son of God. He goes and meets with priests and Levites who question his authority and identity. He announces that he is not the Messiah or a prophet, but rather just a prophetic voice to the people, the pave the path between the people and Jesus. We see him here simply as a witness to the one that God has sent

Observation: Coming into this weeks Gospel, we see that we do not meet John just by chance, but as it is willed, being sent by God himself. As for the purpose of us meeting him, it's not for praise or for worship, but to see a messenger who is destined to light the way for the word of God to be spread as a witness for Jesus. John's role, not just in this weeks Gospel, but in this book, is to make way for the Messiah, doing this through the identity that he has been given by God. We see him introducing himself to the Jews and Levites, authority figures of Jerusalem who oversee activity and people of interest, only to be questions upon his authority and status. After a standoff, a sense of uneasiness resides within the Jews and Levits, only to be comforted by John with a message for the arrival of Jesus.

Application: Although it is the Book of John, and we open with the introduction of John, he himself is never truly the centre of attention, as we see him declare not who he is himself, but when he is not and what he is here to do, rather than an introduction to the character. All we are here to witness here, is the message, that so happens to be passed on by John. One of the most outstanding lines in this is "Make straight the way of the Lord", spoken by John, where two messages can be taken. One to prepare yourself for the coming of Jesus, as well as the ease in which you should make it. Rather than a complicated and defensive path, we should not make it difficult for ourselves of for Jesus to reach our hearts, thus being asked to make a straight way, devoid of complication and ease of travel. In the gospel, John is a symbol and a reminder to bear witness to the messiah. Jesus Christ, the one who has come in the flesh, the one who is here with us, and the one who will come again. Such is the takeaway from this week's gospel.

Prayer: Jesus, when I come upon situations that require serious thought, please send your Holy Spirit to guide me, that I may always do Your holy will. Guide me with Your counsel, and give me the courage to act rightly when it is difficult. Please grant me foresight when the future is unclear. Help me to enter into the unknown without fear, and provide courage to others that need it. Let me be prepared for anything, so that I can better appreciate the surprises that come my way. Amen
