When King from far away and your daughters being tenderly Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the carried. At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of to you; the wealth of the nations come to you; camels in them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in throngs will cover you, and Dromedaries of Midian and Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and wrote: And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Stars and Seekers after Truth

Unlike the writers of the horoscope columns in our newspapers, these Wise Men were scholar astrologers, probably from Syria or Iraq. They believed that the stars controlled the destiny of human beings, but they were open enough to the Hebrew scriptures to be led to the amazing discovery of a star-child in Bethlehem.

They knelt before this baby, doing homage, because they realised that the stars did not control this infant, but that there was something of this baby which caused the night sky to respond! They preserved the child from the deadly schemes of Herod, and then they returned to their home country, 'by a different way'. They were on a different journey after encountering the Child.

Who can doubt that the Holy Spirit led these wise men from the East to the manger? In fact, the Holy Spirit is at work in every human being, prompting each and every one to become seekers after Truth.

As a person responds to this prompting and tries to lead a good humane life, then the Church teaches that the Holy Spirit can draw them into the saving life of God. Thus, billions in China and India who have never heard the Gospel, can be saved. But, such persons do not savour the fullness of Truth as we do with the privilege of having the scriptures and the sacraments. Where it is possible, we are obliged to offer them the road map to the Truth.

We can take a moment to affirm our faith in the baby in the manger as the One of whom Dante spoke: 'the Love which moves the sun and other stars'. Come, let us adore him.

Youth Corner 7th January

Scripture: Matthew 2: 1-12

Observation:

This week's gospel depicts the visitation of the three wise men after the birth of Jesus. The events of the story itself are quite straightforward. The three wise men (Magi) come to Jerusalem in search of Jesus, the newborn king of the Jews, to pay homage, and Herod is threatened by this future king so sent the wise men to Bethlehem and orders them to return to him once they have found Jesus so that he could also go to pay homage, but in reality, he was plotting to end Jesus. The wise men followed the star, offered gifts, paid homage and in a dream, were told not to return to Herod. However, a closer look at this passage, several things are very important to understand. The first is the quoting of the prophecy told in the Old Testament, confirmation that Jesus is more than just the future king of the Jews, but the Shepherd to Israel, the promised Messiah. This is further supported by the actions of the wise men, who were overjoyed, knelt and worshipped

Then there is the comparison and the actions of the wise men vs Herod. The foreign wise men travelled all the way to Jerusalem and Bethlehem so they could celebrate, offer gifts and worship Jesus. Herod said he also wanted to pay homage to Jesus, but he does not go himself, he orders the wise men to come back to him after they have found Jesus. We will later find out that Herod intends on killing Jesus as he wanted to hold onto power.

Application:

In this story, we can try to identify ourselves in the wise men and in Herod. The actions of the wise men were all guided by God in the form of the prophecy, the star, and the dream that warned them at the end. Herod's actions were guided by the desires and insecurities of mankind. The wise men demonstrated complete faith in God and thus in Jesus, choosing to go against the orders of King Herod the Great. All the pressure was on them to not go against Herod, he was the king of Judea.

In our own daily lives, how often have we done things because of self-interest, or simply crumple to societal and peer pressure? It takes great faith and strength to stand against such forces. We must learn to trust in God, be faithful to his teachings and use these to form our conscience, so that we may act accordingly. Strive each day to let God guide our actions, and fight worldly temptations that do not bring glory to God.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we thank you for your wisdom and guidance in our lives. May we keep our hearts open to your teachings, and follow you faithfully despite all of the worldly temptations and self-desires that we may have or encounter. Give us the strength to uphold our faith in you, live and act in love, and continue to worship you. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.
