FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Samuel 1 Sam 3:3-10.19

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am'. Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down." Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up GOSPEL and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called A reading from the holy Gospel according to John me.' Eli then understood that it was the Lord who was calling the boy, and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

The Lord then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.'

COMMENTARY

What's in a Name?

What's in a name? A Lot, if it is God who confers the name. Jesus of Nazareth, the embodiment of God-for-us, knew the power of naming in relation to calling and destiny.

So, when Andrew brought his brother to Jesus, Jesus exercised the divine prerogative of changing Simon's name to 'Cephas' which in English is 'Peter'. Jesus gave Simon a nickname, 'rocksolid' which was the exact opposite of his character! Nevertheless, he did become the rock on which Jesus built his Church.

The tradition continues with the successor of Peter. So, Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio took the name 'Francis' which indicates that he believes that the Holy Spirit inspired the Cardinals to choose him to be Pope to follow in the footsteps of St Francis of Assisi.

Each one of us has a divinely ordained name (Rev 2:17) which we may not be aware of, but the Holy Spirit is always prompting us to live up to that name.

We could pause for a moment to pray that we might so live as to reach Heaven to find that name which God has loved from and for all eternity.



Youth Corner 14th January

Scripture: John 1:35-42, but in particular verses 37 and 41

Observations:

From this passage, where the son of God makes his entrance and catches the attention of John and his two disciples, my attention was drawn as they show initiative trying to understand and follow the Lord: "Rabbi" (which means "Teacher"), where are you staying?" This passage reminds us what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. It is about being in the company of Jesus and wanting to learn more about him. It is wanting to grow your relationship and have faith in Jesus. The Gospel illustrates Jesus' invitation to us: "'Come,' he replied, 'and you will see." This invitation is for us all to stay and remain with Jesus, to follow our faith. His invitation is not conditional but is universal to all who wish to know his grace.

Application:

In our lives, we proclaim we are the brothers and sisters of Christ, but what does that mean? Sometimes we are stagnant in our faith and we are content with what we know and what we don't know. However, Jesus' invitation invites us to stay and learn more about him. As such, as Catholics we should be ever exploring our faith and continually wanting to learn more about our role as disciples of Christ and ultimately his teachings. We should be constantly aiming to develop our relationship with Jesus Christ.

Prayer:

Lord, you are so kind, you always welcome me into your grace. Thank you for the opportunities you have granted me to know you and learn more about you. Thank you for surrounding me with people who facilitate growth and learning. I ask that this joy and urge will be experienced and shared by all as we accept Jesus Christ as our king and savior. Amen.
