FIRST READING

A reading from the prophet Jonah
Jonah 3:1-5. 10

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

COMMENTARY

The Eyes Have It

When Jesus says to Simon, Andrew, James and John 'I will make you into fishers of men', then, amongst the many levels of meaning they would have heard the allusion to Ezekiel 29:3-5.

Jesus was telling them that he was creating a society of liberated human beings, called the 'Kingdom of God'. This would involve struggle against powerful elites, the pharaohs of this world, who oppress and enslave people. It would be as dangerous and demand as much energy as required to haul a crocodile out of the Nile.

Yet they did so, 'straightaway'. Because of the call of Jesus? No. At least, not that alone. We read 'He saw Simon and his brother Andrew . . . He saw James and his brother John.' They were responding not to his voice alone but to his eyes. His is like the attentive gaze of a parent loving a baby into a beautiful future. Jesus looks at you and at me wanting to love us into a barely imaginable future.

We could pause for a moment to remember that when His call comes, demanding an 'aye' or a 'nay', the Eyes have it .

Youth Corner

Youth Corner 21st January

Scripture : Mark 1: 14-20

Observations

In this passage, we witness the beginning of Jesus' mission of ministry following John the Baptist's arrest. Further in the passage, Jesus encounters Simon and Andrew, inviting them to become his disciples and transforming them into "fishers of men." They respond immediately, leaving behind their former lives to follow Jesus. This observation emphasises Jesus' initiative in calling people to discipleship, the immediate and wholehearted response of the disciples, and the change in life that occurs following Jesus. It is a powerful example of the transformative nature of encountering Jesus and the willingness to make sacrifices for discipleship, reminding us of the journey that awaits those who choose/continue to follow him.

Application

As Catholics, we often proclaim ourselves to be the brothers and sisters of Christ. But what does that truly mean? Sometimes, we find ourselves stagnant in our faith, settling for what we already know and what we don't. However, Jesus' invitation extends to us an opportunity to remain and delve deeper into our understanding of Him. Therefore, it is crucial for us to consistently explore our faith, always seeking knowledge of our role as disciples of Christ and His teachings.

Dear God,

Thank you for your love and care you continue to provide throughout our lives. We pray that you grant us the grace to respond to your call with unwavering faith and eagerness to follow you, following the footsteps of Simon and Andrew from the passage.
