Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

# The Divine Touch

The mother-in-law of Simon (Peter) was sick in bed with a raging fever. When Jesus learned about her distressed state, he 'took her by the hand and helped her up'. He broke the taboo about physical contact with a woman not his relative because he wanted to holistically heal her disease.


Simon's mother-in-law didn't need an aspirin and a cup of tea. She felt guarantined, isolated, and needed a hand reassuring her of sociable relationships. Jesus overcame her fever and her dis-ease with the world. At every Mass we exchange a physical gesture at the greeting of Peace. This guite often overcomes ill-at-ease with а member or just with the neighbour in the pew. We need to take that symbolic action into the world. For somebody, it may be the most touching thing we ever do.

We could pause for a moment to identify that person who needs us to reach out, to take their hand and help them up.

## **Youth Corner 4th February**

Scripture: Mark 1: 29-39

#### Observation

In today's Gospel, we see Jesus's compassion. Though it was the Sabbath Day and the law necessitates that no work be done on the day, Jesus felt compelled to cure Simon's mother-in-law because she was ill. Later in the Gospel, Jesus continues to show His healing power by curing the sick and casting out demons. Despite all this work, Jesus still made time to pray and speak with God, His Father.

#### **Application**

There are two things we can learn from the Gospel today. The first is Jesus's willingness to help people. As Catholics, we are called to be available and assist people who are in need. After Jesus heard about Simon's mother-in-law, He didn't dilly-dally. Jesus didn't take a stroll in the park with his friends or watch TikTok videos on his phone. Jesus went to heal Simon's mother immediately. He helped those in need without hesitation and we are called to do the same.

The second thing we can learn from the Gospel is Jesus's role in our lives. Yes, Jesus is the healer. Just as He cured all the sick people in the Gospel and casted out demons, He can also heal the aching in our souls. We know that we can rely on Jesus to mend our hearts and take away the pain. However, just as Jesus left the crowded to go to a quiet place to pray, we must also remember that Jesus's role in our lives is not just to heal. He doesn't want to only be a part of our lives when we have illnesses that need curing or wounds that need healing. He wants to have a relationship with us. In order for us to foster that relationship with Him, we must pray and pray regularly. Not only to ask for Jesus to do things for us but also to praise Him, give thanksgiving to Him and get to know Him.

#### **Prayer**

Lord, we need your healing; but even more, we need a relationship with you. Help us to know you and develop a deeper faith in you so that we can make you known to others also. Give us a compassionate heart so that we may imitate Jesus in His love for others so that we may better help those in need. Amen.
