## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

# COMMENTARY

# Where does God really dwell?

The Ten Commandments are badly named. Rather, they are the Ten Responses which should characterise a liberated people, freed from slavery by 'the Lord, your God'.

By the time Jesus came on the scene, the Temple in Jerusalem was no longer a fit dwelling place for a God who desires to from oppression and free people exploitation. To the contrary, Jesus saw the Temple ideology as placing undue burdens and shackles on people.

His anger at this erupted in dramatic street theatre. His overturning of the tables of the money-changers signalled the overturning of the Temple system.

What Our Lord revealed to uncomprehending authorities was that His body was the true sanctuary. The body of Jesus of Nazareth is the dwelling place of God, the habitation of the Lord God who liberates people. In short, God's sanctuary is not a place, but a person.

We could take a moment to pray, using the Ten Responses to review and guide our reflection and practice as we move towards Easter. This will help us to celebrate the enigmatic saying: 'Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it again.'

## **SOAP Reflection 3rd March**

## Scripture: John 2:13-22

Observation: One of the interesting things for me in today's Gospel is that you could take two different messages away from the Gospel because it is almost split into 2 parts. The first section is probably the one that most people know the best, it describes a moment in which Jesus 'loses his cool'. People are often confused as to why Jesus got so angry at the people in the temple. It was not as if the people were defrauding people, or committing crimes, nor were they acting with malicious intent. Yet Jesus, runs the people out of the temple with force. The reason for this is not because of what they were doing, but where they were doing it. By conducting business in the temple of God they are depriving others of the opportunity to pray, the opportunity to have their connection to God. Jesus, in this passage is not condemning the act of doing business, but instead he is telling us that there is a time and a place for that, and it isn't in the place of worship of God. The second half refers to when Jesus talks with the Jews and says he will destroy the temple and raise it up again in three days. It is then noted in the passage that the temple Jesus was referring to was his body. But what is the purpose of this section of the passage, why is it notable that the Jews talked about the temple being built in 46 years vs Jesus building it in 3 days, is it just to show how much more powerful Jesus is then us people? The answer is no, see, the temple which the Jews refer to as being built in 46 years was built by King Herrod in order to try and convince the people that he was the Messiah as the prophets foretold that the Messiah would build a new temple. Now, it becomes clear that Jesus is telling them that he is the Messiah that will build a temple but of his body rather than an earthly structure. The reason that Jesus tells the Jews this now is because the Jews asked him "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this" Basically asking him what gives you the right to do this. To which Jesus replies, although cryptically, that he is the Messiah.

Application: Both of the Gospel's messages can be applied to our lives. The first one being the idea of doing the right thing in the right place and time, is very applicable to our current circumstance. Probably applicable in the current moment you are reading this. The idea is that a place of worship, the church, is simply that and we shouldn't be doing things that go against that purpose. Going to Church should not be for a purpose other than to have a relationship with God and to grow deeper in your love and understanding of him. We should always try our hardest to stay focused on the worship of God when at mass. Like the people in the temple doing trade, even if the actual activity itself is not inherently bad nor are our intentions malicious it isn't the right place or the right time to, for example, think about what you're going to have for lunch. The second message that being Jesus' conveyance to the Jews of his nature can also be applied to our lives. Sometimes we can be fixated on the wrong things, like the Jews and the Temple we can be hyper fixated on the material world. So much so that we can conflate Jesus' teachings and Gospel to apply in ways that they shouldn't. As the Jews thought that the Messiah's temple would be a physical temple they couldn't comprehend that the Scripture could mean anything else beyond their narrow, material world view of what that could mean. We must avoid this mistake and keep our minds and hearts open to the true meaning of Jesus' teachings.

**Prayer:** Dear Lord, I pray that you can aid me in growing in my understanding and love of you. I pray for guidance as I know I do not know all the answers and I place my trust into your hands that you will show me the truth. Teach me to learn in your ways and to remain diligent in my prayer with you. In your name I pray Amen
