COMMENTARY

The Voice

In the regions where Jesus was an itinerant preacher, three or four flocks could be kept in a communal sheepfold for safety. In the morning, the shepherds would come and, as each called out, the sheep attuned to the sound of his voice would follow to life-giving pasture.

We are surrounded by hundreds of voices clamouring for our attention. We are bombarded by messages, social media incessantly chattering. Jesus invites us to get attuned to his voice, listening for the distinctive sound of it so that, even if it is faintly heard in a cacophony, we immediately turn toward it so that we can follow it in a life-giving direction.

How do we get attuned to that voice? By reading the gospels. A Chinese student once told me that the Chinese character for gospel is 'happy sounds'. I like the plural. Jesus' gospel voice is not a monotone but a polyphony sounding in different ways in different situations.

As disciples, we have to get onto the same wavelength as that voice so that we can echo it in our own lives. We become reverberations of Christ's voice in many different situations, helping him to lead others to life-giving pastures.

We could take a moment to pray for better listening so that we might recognise the gospel voice of Jesus Christ, especially at the moment of death. Then we may hear the one voice we need and long for: 'Today you will be with me in paradise.'

SOAP Reflection 21st April

Scripture: John 10: 11-18

Observation

Today's Gospel begins with Jesus stating that he is "the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep". Jesus being the good shepherd came down from heaven and was nailed to the cross as a sacrifice for our sins. Jesus laid down his life for us so that we are able to come before God and reconcile with him. This act demonstrates Jesus' selfless love and salvation for us. Being the sheep we like to flock together due to the mentality of safety in numbers. We surround ourselves with like-minded people. We tend to follow the crowd and so we typically follow the wrong people and ideas which eventually lead us to sin. The hired hand in this passage represents the materialistic things and ideas we idolise in our life. The hired hand fails to protect us, they do nothing but pull us into the wrong direction. Eventually we are snatched by the wolf which represents sin and evil. Jesus being the good shepherd is slowly gathering the sheep who have not yet found his flock. He reminds us that he is the one who truly cares for us and that he is the one who will save us from sin.

Application

The passage reminds us how easy it is to be lost and not know Jesus. In today's society there are many sinful acts which are normalised which further causes a divide between us and God. If we continue to indulge in these acts we are essentially consumed by sin. In order to apply this passage in our life we should accept Jesus' calling into his flock. We should accept this invitation as it surrounds us with a community of faith. Being in this community helps better strengthen our relationship with God. By developing this loving relationship with God we are able to take small steps away from the things that cause us to sin. We should continually appreciate the sacrifice Jesus made and use that as a reminder to help us stay on the path God has intended for us.

Prayer

Dear God, I pray that I strive to live according to your ways and may you continue to guide me on the right path. I pray for those who have not found your flock yet and hope that they accept your calls so that they can experience salvation. I pray that I will continue to rid sin out of my life and trust in Jesus as my saviour. Amen
