COMMENTARY

The Voice which Accompanies to the Other Side

Every element of the universe, even the most destructive, is listening for the voice of Our Lord, "Quiet, be still." In this Gospel story, the waters of chaos respond to the voice of the Lord of all creation, allowing Jesus to accompany his disciples to the other side of the Sea of Galilee.

We all know of times when chaos storms into our life, when we feel we are being swamped whether from outside or from some part of our own personality. Some part of our life is facing death. We may cry out to Jesus "Don't you care?".

He will come to accompany us but always to "the other side". Our Lord does not indulge the fantasy of "turning back the clock". We have to keep rowing in a new direction. There is no nostalgic return to the old situation. We may well feel displaced, disoriented, but Our Lord is our companion in the unfamiliar situation we have reached.

We could take a moment to pray for Our Lord to help us in all life-threatening situations, especially in the final transit through the wrenching chaos of death. May we hear him rebuke the Prince of Darkness and Death: "Quiet, be still" as he accompanies us to the other side, to the promised land of Heaven.

SOAP Reflection 23rd June

Scripture: Mark 4: 35-41

Observation

Throughout the New Testament, we may find ourselves relating to the disciples in their tentative and sometimes tenuous faith in Jesus. I personally always found the humanity of the disciples comforting, knowing that even those closest to Jesus during his time on earth (and many of whom went on to become saints), struggled with their faith at times too!

In this passage, we can observe the dichotomy of trust and doubt in each half of the story, and reflect upon how impulse and fear weakens our faith in God.

Though the disciples initially trusted and were obedient to Jesus' instructions to travel with him to the other side of the lake, that faith quickly crumbled when their boat was rocked by furious winds and storms. Despite witnessing his emboldened preaching and inexplicable miracles (casting out demons in Mark 3), the disciples are quick to fall into a frenzied panic and at one point (possibly in their hysteria), even accuse Jesus of lacking regard for their welfare/wellbeing. It isn't until Jesus awakens and calms the winds and waves that his disciples regain their composure and marvel at his authority over nature.

Application

Though the dangers and uncertainty of sea travel may not be of particular relevance to us in the same way it was to the disciples, I feel that this passage paints a common experience among Catholics. We may find that when times are good, following Christ comes naturally, like sparing a moment for prayer when we're not in a rush that day, or giving some spare change to someone in need when we have a few coins we have been meaning to get rid of.

However, it's when the walls come crashing down and we are feeling overwhelmed that we really need to entrench ourselves in faith and be aware of the corrosive effect fear and impulse can have on our trust in God and His plan. When we feel the furious winds and waves of life batter our boat from all sides, acknowledge your feelings and offer them up to the Lord. Lean into faith rather than pull away, and ask others to pray for you. God never gives us a cross we cannot carry, and though we may not always be able to see His plan through the storm, we too can trust in his authority and power (just like the disciples).

Prayer

Dear Lord, help me trust you with my decisions and future. Let me lean on you with all my heart instead of relying on my own imperfect understanding. Please grant me clear guidance in my life where I need it, and direct my path as you see fit. Help me to steady the ship of my life. In Jesus' name, Amen.
