Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd


followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

### **COMMENTARY**

### A young lad and the hungers of humanity

The disciples fell into the verbal trap which Jesus set. They believed that market forces should dictate how the hunger of the crowd could be satisfied. It was a young lad who put the disciples to shame, simply handing over five barley loaves and two fish to Jesus. It was because of his generosity that Divine generosity was able to feed the crowd.

Divine desire to satisfy the hungers of humanity for the various necessities of life (food, shelter, companionship, education, medicines) require human generosity. Otherwise, Divine Compassion cannot be effective in the world.

Voluntary renunciation of property and sharing of wealth still occurs in the little oases of monasteries and convents, echoes of the radical redistribution of wealth recorded in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 4:32-35). St Luke makes it clear that this was essentially linked to the Apostles' testifying to the Resurrection 'with great power'.

Francis of Assisi and now Francis of Buenos Aires remind us that the Church itself needs to engage in the redistribution of its wealth to enable the hungers of humanity to be satisfied. This will give authenticity to its preaching of the Gospel, and enable its evangelising to be undertaken 'with great power'.

We could take a moment to pray that we become more like the little boy in the Gospel, more like Francis of Assisi, more like Francis of Buenos Aires, voluntarily sharing our wealth to satisfy the hungers of humanity.

### SOAP Reflection 28 July

Scripture: John 6: 1-15

**Observation:** 

The first thing to note is in this week's gospel is God's providence. Jesus knew that the crowd that had followed him was spiritually hungry. Afterall, they had followed him wherever he went to hear him preach, but Jesus also recognised their physical hunger and knew that the crowd required physical sustenance as well as spiritual. God knows what we need. We only need to trust that He will provide.

The second thing that stood out was abundance. God not only provide but He provides in abundance. When Andrew brought the five barley loaves and two fish to Jesus, he asks "...but what are these among so many?". It's a question of helplessness and doubt. Surely, when the apostles realised that Jesus was intending to feed the crowd with five loaves of bread and two measly little fishes, they must have thought there was absolutely no way this was going to happen. Yet, Jesus did just that and more. So much so there were twelve baskets of food remaining after everyone had had their fill.

The last thing that was observed in the gospel was the boy that brought the five loaves and two fish. It is suggested in the gospel that the boy was young and poor as the loaves were described to be "barley loaves", with barley being common among the poor. Yet despite this, the boy offered what he had. He could have kept quiet and eaten his meal himself but this was not what he did. He acted with love and selflessness in hoping that his contribution could potentially alleviate the hunger of the crowd around him.

**Application:** 

Sometimes it is hard to see God's plan for our lives. We often struggle to or forget to put our lives into God's hands and to trust in his providence. But we see in today's gospel, God's love for us is abundant and overfilling and he will provide everything we need as long as we put it into His hands. If we remember to put all our helpsessness and things we deem to be impossible into God's hands, he will provide us with what we need. And just like the boy in the gospel today, we are called to offer what we have in service to God and our community. Even if it's as small as five loaves and two fish, God will multiply that offering and make it so plentiful that it is felt by everyone around.

**Prayer:** 

Heavenly Father, I choose to put my everything into your hands. My failures, my successes, my concerns, my joys; I lay them all down knowing that you love me and know what is best for my life and will provide for me accordingly. Help me to remember to be your hands and feet and to serve selflessly with the knowledge that the love I pour out to those around me serves as a reflection of Your love
