FIRST READING Joshua 24:1-2. 15-18 A reading from the book of Joshua

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed. SECOND READING Ephesians 5:21-32 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would

be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.


Then Jesus said to the Twelve, What about you,

### COMMENTARY

### The Word of Eternal Life

I remember seeing a James Bond film in which the Voodoo priest could summon the Living Dead called Zombies – people hovering between life in the grave and life above ground level, but ultimately trapped as human beings living a grave-dominated existence.

There are billions of the Living Dead around the world. People, apparently like you and me, but in fact living with the belief that the grave will mark the extinction of their life.

But our ears are attuned to pick up words which sound the possibility of a different destiny, a different reality. We have heard a voice which speaks the truth, a voice which speaks of a more beautiful reality. That voice says that you and I, individually, personally, are star dust with a marvellous destiny: a destiny that will see our transformed, ensouled bodieś transfigured, translucent with Divine Light and energy.

The voice is that of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We hear that voice from within the Church, which has transmitted the tradition of 'The Voice' for twenty centuries.

Heeding that Voice, I move from the company of the Living Dead to the companionship of the Conqueror of Death. I am no longer a 'Dead Man Walking' but a man alive with the reality of eternal life already within me.

That is why when I hear the challenge: 'Do you also wish to go away?' I enter into that tradition and answer with St Peter, I answer in the company of billions of others over twenty centuries: 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life '

We could pause for a moment and pray that, living in the tradition of the Church, I may hear the Word in the Gospel and take that Word within myself in Holy Communion so that I might be no longer a 'Dead Man Walking', but a human being alive with the reality of eternal life already within me.

### **SOAP Reflection 25th August**

Scripture: John 6:60-69

Observation: The passage in today's Gospel details an event where a large proportion of Jesus' followers desert him. The context for this is found in the earlier parts of the Chapter. In John chapter 6 Jesus first feeds the 5000, then walks on water, then reveals that the only way to reach salvation is to eat his flesh and drink his blood. It's that last thing that made many leave Jesus. The idea that to reach salvation one would have to eat another human was seen as barbaric. As a result, despite many people seeing first-hand the miracles of Jesus they still reject him because they couldn't possibly eat his flesh. And what Peter says in the Gospel when Jesus questions if he will leave, Peter says "Lord to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life". Peter understands that Jesus is the true God, thus even though he may or may not be initially uncomfortable with eating Jesus' flesh and drinking Jesus' blood he knows that Jesus is the only path to true salvation and that God would never instruct him or anyone to do something if it weren't for their benefit.

### **Application:**

In today's world it can be challenging to be a Catholic. Catholic beliefs are often criticised by others for being too backwards or "not keeping up with the times". What we should take from this Gospel is that this is not necessarily something new. Christian and Catholic beliefs have been criticised for being strange since before the Catholic Church was instituted. It was also true then as it is true now that when being a Catholic comes with doing hard things people lose faith and they reject it, not necessarily because they believe God is evil or bad but because it is difficult. But we must remind ourselves to be like Peter and understand; one, God is our only way to eternal happiness and salvation and so giving that up for some short term gratification would be imprudent. And two, God would never call us to do something if it weren't for our benefit, God wouldn't ask us to consume his flesh and blood if it didn't help us get to eternal life and happiness. So if you as a young Catholic find some parts of being a Catholic difficult whether that be avoiding sin, receiving anger towards you etc you must stay firm in your beliefs. Exhibit the virtue of fortitude, to do what is right even if it is difficult.

### Prayer

Jesus, I pray that as I continue to grow deeper in my faith and love with you I do not falter in my conviction to love and be with you for eternity. I pray that you grant me with the virtue of fortitude to remain firm in my love and adoration for you. And I thank you for all you have given me and all which you have done to save us from the everlasting pain of being separated from you. In your name I pray. Amen
