

COMMENTARY

Not from, but for, the World

What are we to make of the famous reply of Jesus to Pilate: 'My kingdom is not of this world'? Left there, it sounds as though Jesus is talking about a realm which is far removed from terrestrial concerns. Perhaps our task as his followers is to meditate into a blissful nothingness, to live other-worldy lives.

It is a poor translation, and it should read: 'My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would have fought to stop my being handed over.' Of all the ways in which our Lord could have contrasted his realm with all the other ways in which societies are ruled, he chose a contrast about the use of force. Rather, his reign springs from his Father's will that humanity should live together in a realm of non-violence.

We can easily criticise ISIL's blasphemous use of barbaric violence in the supposed service of religion. It is the most extreme opposite of Our Lord's teaching which He embodied in his practice. But, even for us, the challenge is there to restrain too-ready resort to armed violence and to humanely moderate its exercise where it is used to protect the innocent.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the coming of the Kingdom, not as an 'out of this world' experience, but in the words of the Our Father: 'Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.'

SOAP Reflection 24th November

Scripture: John 18:33-37

Observation:

In this Gospel, Pilate and Jesus converse and Jesus reveals to Pilate his identity. He reveals to him that he is not claiming to be king of the Jews but as a king of a different nature. Jesusmis not an Earthly king he does not claim power through conquest and strength, he does not forcibly subjugate people as Earthly kings do. This should clear Jesus of the charges laid against him. The Jews brought Jesus to Pilate to be put to death for "claiming to be king of the Jews", which Jesus plainly denies. Yet Pilate, in the next passages does not step in to defend Jesus after this, he wipes his hands clean and tells the crowd to do whatever they wish. Despite being given the truth so plainly and simply Pilate does not act upon it.

Application:

How often can we be like Pilate? We are given ample opportunity to be given the truth, everyday we are given the gift of the good news. Yet so often, we fall to weakness. We do not defend Jesus, we can let him be misrepresented, we can let others misconstrue his words but we stand aside. As Children of God we should not simply wipe our hands clean and let our faith be attacked. Pilate is given the truth and yet does nothing, his inaction puts our Lord to death. It is the same with us, we are given the truth, but it is up to us to use our knowledge to spread good news, to go out and do something with it, not just to hear it, wash our hands of it, and let it sit in the back of our minds. The truth, the good news should always be at the forefront of our actions throughout our whole lives.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father grant, me the strength and courage to stand with our faith. Let me be used as a vessel to spread your word so that all may know you and allow for your spirit to work through me. In your name I pray. Amen
