

SOAP Reflection 15th December

Scripture: Luke 3: 10-18

Observation: In this passage, we find Jesus' cousin, John the Baptist, urging the crowds around the Jordan River as to what they should do to prepare for the coming of Christ. Though it's not made clear in this passage, reading the verses preceding this reveal that John is speaking to a predominantly Jewish crowd, whom he boldly pronounces to be a 'brood of vipers' seeking to 'flee from the coming retribution.' (Luke 3:7) John warns the Jews (many of whom believe they would be saved by birthright as descendants of Abraham) not to fall victim to complacency, reminding them that as God's chosen people (a nation of priests; see Exodus 19:6 and 1 Peter 2:9) they are called to live as examples of kindness, charity and justice. He explains that doing so does not require great miracles of prophetic scale, but simply being prepared to provide for and serve those in need with compassion and respect.

Application: In modern times, we may not think of ourselves as 'God's chosen people' or 'descendants of Abraham,' but I'm sure many of us do consider our religious beliefs to be a crucial part of our identity. Like the Jewish people of Jesus' time, we too are called to live in service of others, but may catch ourselves falling short of that mark - perhaps the side effect of a world which exhorts self-interest and self-promotion above all else. Whilst it is true that we will ultimately be saved by our faith and not by our actions or deeds, we must not neglect our mission to love and serve others. I would highly recommend reflecting upon James 2:17-24, which reaffirms John's message in plain language - "In the same way faith, if good deeds do not go with it, is quite dead... It is by my deeds that I will show you my faith." As we approach Christmas, let us pray not for more gifts or material objects, but for a heart more like Jesus, a heart ready to serve and moved by compassion for those in need around us!

Prayer: Dear God, I ask for your guidance and strength to help me serve others. Please remind me that every person I encounter is created in your image and deserves to be treated with love and respect. Help me to see the needs of those around me and be willing to step in and help in any way I can. Whether it's offering a kind word, a listening ear, or a helping hand, please give me the courage and compassion to serve others selflessly. Amen.
