A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtle-doves or

two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God, and he said: 'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.

As 'the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected – and a sword will pierce your own soul too -so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him. The Gospel of the Lord

SOAP Reflection on 2nd February

Scripture - Luke 2:22-40

Observation:

Today's gospel begins with Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the temple to present him to God (to fulfil the obligations detailed in Leviticus 12:3-8). During this time, Jesus is greeted by two notable individuals, Simeon and Anna. We are first introduced to Simeon, a devout and righteous man, who has been waiting patiently for the "consolation of Israel". He had been promised by the Holy Ghost that he would see Christ before he died; this promise was finally fulfilled when he met Jesus. Similarly, Anna is a prophetess and widow who fasts and prays day and night for the redemption of Jerusalem. Both individuals are devout and patient; having waited years for the joy they finally receive. Particularly Simeon, says this prayer to God: "Because my eyes have seen thy salvation... A light to the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel." His patience was rewarded with God's salvation.

Application:

When we experience doubt, or feel that our prayers are left unanswered, this passage brings hope and an important reminder that joy comes through the waiting. Both Simeon and Anna have waited patiently for many years until their prayers were answered, but the joy they experienced in having Christ as the light of their lives is simply unmatched, especially the greatest sacrifice of all, Jesus' death on the cross for our salvation. Despite our doubts, we experience the joy brought upon by Jesus, and it is a joy well worth the wait. Particularly in moments of uncertainty or waiting, we shall continue to practice patience and trust that we too will live out God's will according to his plans. Let us continue to pray for the grace to remain steadfast in our faith, afterall, God's answers to our prayers often come in unexpected ways.

Praver:

Dear Lord, thank you for sending Your only Son Jesus to be the light of our lives. Thank you for saving us from the evils of sins through Your sacrifice. Lord, we pray for the grace to remain steadfast in our faith and patience, so that we may continue to trust in Your perfect timing, even during periods of uncertainty. May we always recognise Your love and presence in our lives, and find joy and comfort in knowing that Your plans for us are good. Lord, may Your light always shine brightly on us, guiding us and others closer to You. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
