

Scripture: John 10:27-30

Observation: This week is the Fourth Sunday of Easter, otherwise known as Good Shepherd Sunday. This week's Gospel is a continuation of Jesus' parable earlier in John, chapter 10, where Jesus says "I am the good shepherd". During this Good Shepherd Sunday, we acknowledge Jesus as that Good Shepherd who knows each and every one of His sheep (the Church) and gives His life for them. The Gospel this week reminds us of the eternal life that is awaiting us if we follow Jesus as He says that his sheep will be given eternal life if they follow him.

Moreover, Jesus highlights the glory of God the Father in this Gospel in saying that the Father is greater than all" and alludes to the Trinitarian God in this passage.

Application: The Gospel for this week aims to remind of our salvation through the risen Christ and it is through this that we have been brought into His flock- the Church. Through the Catholic Church and through Mass, we are invited to partake in our Good Shepherd's Eucharistic Sacrifice as He pours His life into our souls and give us eternal life.

As we attend Mass every Sunday, we are reminded of this passage, through not only the Eucharist but also our priests and clergy. Just as Jesus appointed Peter to lead His flock as the first Pope, our priests and clergy are the shepherd of their parishes and communities.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I thank you being the Good Shepherd in my life and giving Your life so I may have eternal life with you. May I always be reminded to listen to your voice and follow your commandments.

I pray also for the vocation of the Holy Orders. May those You have chosen answer Your call to a life of leadership and may you guide them through their journey to become good shepherds of the Church. Amen.
