

Scripture: John 13:31-35

Observation: Soon after Judas left the night of the Last Supper, Jesus declares that in his glorification of the Lord, he will suffer death and be resurrected. Then, Jesus says to his disciples, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you..." The instruction of loving one another seems simple enough; I can surely say that I love my friends and family, in my words and in my actions. Yet, why does this commandment seem to leave our minds the moment we are faced with people we feel have wronged us. It seems logical enough that we don't love everyone the same way; and it seems self-explanatory that one would love their family much more intensely than a stranger, let alone someone who has hurt us. It is difficult to do so, yet Jesus reminds us that to love those around us, regardless of our opinion on them, is to truly carry out our own discipleships.

Application: It can often feel difficult to love those who we feel have hurt us, or feel that we have the capacity to love absolutely everyone. But, I think it is important to remember that love can take action in many ways; whether it is service, sacrifice or forgiveness. Rather than how we love or who we love, it is important to remember why we love; and that is to simply live out our faith, that our mission is to love. We reflect God not only in what we believe, but in how we treat others; faith without works, stemming in love, is ingenuine. When we feel that we are losing the ability to love because we feel deceived or betrayed, God's instruction is simple and He is reason enough to love those around us.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank you for your endless love for us, that You sent Your only son Jesus to die for us in the ultimate act of love. Please guide us to emulate your love in our daily lives, no matter how difficult it may feel. Give us the strength to overcome the selfish thoughts which may be preventing us from loving those around us and may we continue to live out Your will through acts of love. Amen.
