**FIRST READING Acts** 2:1-11 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when súddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.

# **Holy Ghost, Holy Gust**

In the very old days, the 'Holy Spirit' was known as the 'Holy Ghost'. It comes from the old English word 'gust' which 'blows wherever it pleases'. St Luke's account of Pentecost tells of what 'sounded like a powerful wind from heaven'. This is the Divine Wind, this is the Holy Gust, the Holy Spirit. 


Scripture: John 20:19-23


**Observation:** Jesus appears to his disciples while they are hiding from the Jews, scared for their lives. He appears to them and shows them his hands with holes in them and says, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you' as evidence that he is the same Jesus who had led them before his death. He proceeds to bless them with the holy spirit.

**Application:** As another Sunday for Pentecost comes around, I'm sure there are times in the past year when you have asked yourself if Jesus is watching you. Does Jesus know that my faith isn't as strong as it could be? Jesus is always looking out for us, his followers, in simple ways, such as attending church and praying, which connect us to Him. Church is a central location for connection to prayer, where we communicate with Jesus through prayer. We reaffirm our faith every time we go to church because we believe in Jesus. Praying to him is not only us talking to Jesus; he listens to us and takes care of whatever troubles us. A friend once told me a story about a man and God walking in the sand together and when the man looked back he realised there are gaps in his path and these gaps happen to be when he was at his lowest and he asks God why there's only one set of footprints, why would God leave him at his lowest times but He tells the man that at the lowest times he was too weak to walk with God so He carries him until he feels strong enough to walk again. I sometimes interpret this story as God will never leave us, and when we hit our lowest points, He will always do something to bring us back up, whether it be an appearance or just small miracles.

**Prayer:** Jesus, in the fear of unknown days, You come to us with peace no matter what. As You stood with Your disciples, showing them Your scars, we ask You to stand with us to strengthen our faith in You. We thank you for the courage You gave us to stand against our moments of fear and doubt. Fill us with Your holy spirit so that we can carry out Your mission of forgiveness and spread Your word. Amen.
