Genesis 18:20-32

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'


Colossians 2:12-14

GOSPEL

Luke 11:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants.

'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

COMMENTARY

Heaven and Earth can coincide

People often imagine huge distance between Earth and a Heaven beyond the horizon of the universe. But Jesus Christ taught us to pray 'Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.'

How can this come about? Jesus identified two areas on which we need to focus to help make Heaven and Earth share the same space.

'Give us this day our daily bread.' This petition is very real for most inhabitants of the world – a plea for the necessities of life to stave off real hunger. If we respond to this plea, we can change a Hellish situation to a place where Heaven and Earth coincide.

'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' But, first to Shakespeare: 'The quality of Mercy is not strained. It falleth as the gentle rain of Heaven on to the place beneath.'

If we develop a hardness of heart which refuses to show forgiveness, then we are like earth concreted over and are unable to absorb God's forgiveness into our own lives. When we forgive someone, we become more able to absorb the gentle rain of heavenly mercy and forgiveness.

So, Heaven and Earth need not be as distant as supposed. Our Lord has shown us how we can help make these dimensions of existence coincide.

We could take a moment to resolve to pray the 'Our Father' by our lives, helping to provide evidence for our acclamation:

'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Hosts, Heaven and Earth are full of your Glory'

Youth Corner

Scripture: Luke 1:1-13

Observation: Here, we are introduced to the book of Luke. He greets us by stating the purpose of his writing, not as view of what has occurred, but as to document them as they happened. Unlike others, Luke differentiates himself and commits to a true retelling to the individual, Theophilus, who we understand to be an official of some kind, who would then have passed these passages around in the early church. Luke then depicts the origin of John the Baptist and the story that came up before it, that of his parents Zechariah and Elizabeth. Described as almost perfect followers of God, but unable to conceive due to their old age. But seemingly, through their blameless lives, they are visited by an angel during his time as a priest, announcing that Elizabeth would finally bear a child, John the Baptist, a powerful herald of the Messiah. The angel's announcement suggests that prayers for a child have been a regular part of Zechariah's life. Now, those requests will be granted. Elizabeth will conceive, at last, and they will have a son.

Application: Though it may seem as such, that you will be rewarded for your blameless life, we should not be leading such a life just to receive the gifts of God. In this passage, Zechariah and his wife's prayers were answered, seemingly through the life that they had led. But, should we lead such a life, to chase such rewards? Absolutely not. In my experience, I have often found myself cutting corners when attempting achieve something, or to make things look a certain way in chasing that goal. So how will that look when it is applied to faith? Going to church every week to appear to be following God, in hopes for eternal life when you do not pay attention to the scripture? Though there is not much to take from this passage as this acts as an introduction, we can also take that even though in this story, it seems like though Zechariah's life and dedication to his faith was strong enough that he was rewarded with the birth of John the Baptist, we should not take this as causation, as that will lead to expectation. In fact, we can simply be happy that we stive to lead the blameless, unblemished, uncriticizable life through our faith.

Prayer: Lord, I pray that I may lead a blameless life. Guide me through life's tough decisions in the way that it should be intended, in your image. Let me shine and be the example upon others to inspire goodness in your grace, not that I may receive your gifts, but to better those around me. Amen.
