Scripture: Luke 16:19-31

Observation: Today's Gospel passage serves to remind us of the dangers of materialism and the irreversible consequences after death. Materialism refers to all the earthly matters that draw us away from God. We see how the rich man lives his life in comfort, while Lazarus, a beggar, lays at the rich man's gate and suffers for the scraps of his table. Eventually, both reach the afterlife and Lazarus is carried up to heaven while the rich man is tormented in hell. The message seems clear; those who are indulgent and selfish, and choose to live in blissful ignorance to the poverty around them will face the consequences in the afterlife.

The passage also reveals to us the irreversible consequences of our actions after death. In the passage, God rejects the rich man's plea for mercy. But isn't our God meant to be merciful and all-loving? God only replies with the truth. The reality is that our actions have consequences. It is evident that the "great chasm" separating the rich man and Lazarus is not because of God's judgement or punishment, but because of the rich man's selfish desires and self-indulgent lifestyle. His rejection towards scripture has allowed a "chasm" to form,

separating him from God.

Application: In the passage, Lazarus lays at the rich man's gate, which is representative of the condition of our hearts. We may be like the rich man, not in terms of monetary wealth, but in our closed heart and ignorance towards those who are in need of compassion. Our actions reflect who we are and not choosing to open ourselves to giving, sharing, loving others

affects our relationship with God. Are we, like the rich man, finding ourselves complacent and self-righteous? Attending mass, saying prayer and reading Scripture does not certify us an afterlife in heaven. As Catholics, we must also be heeding the Commandments and be active witnesses to the Gospel. This parable challenges us to reflect on where we are placing our priorities and how we are spending our time, money and abilities to serve others. If we are not using our 'riches' to serve others, then we are not serving God. Our time on Earth is finite, and this parable reminds us that one day we will be faced with the inevitable outcomes of our actions.

So, I'd like you to take a moment during your day today to reflect on what are the closed gates or doors separating you from sharing, forgiving, loving those around you. What would help alleviate these barriers? Perhaps going to confession, attending adoration or bible study, or listening to a podcast this week can help open your heart and redirect you to those

Prayer: Dear God, In a world of turmoil, hate and selfishness, may we be a reflection of Your ever loving compassion and love and be a messenger of peace and love to others. Please open our ears to the needs of the poor and our hearts to care for those most vulnerable. With the gifts You have granted us, may we be active witnesses to the Gospel and fulfill the plan You have laid before us. In Your Son's name we pray, Amen.
