We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have fallen asleep, to make sure that you do not grieve for them, as others do who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that in the same way God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that we who are still alive for the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have fallen asleep. At the signal given by the voice of the Archangel and the trumpet of God, the Lord himself will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and only after that shall we who remain alive be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. Scripture: John 14:1-6

Observation: In this week's gospel, Jesus comforts his disciples before his passion. His disciples are confused by Jesus' words but Jesus tells them that He is not leaving them in abandonment but in preparation to ready a place for them in heaven. He promises his disciples that one day, they will share in eternal life with Him. His promise reveals His deep love and care, ensuring that His followers will one day share_eternal communion with Him. Jesus' answer to Thomas' question is profound: He Himself is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Jesus is not merely a guide to God — He is the only path to God the Father, to divine truth, and the source of eternal life.

Application: When we face uncertainty, fear, or loss, Jesus' words "Do not let your hearts be troubled" invite us to trust Him more deeply. Faith in God means surrendering our troubles and worries and allowing the peace of God to come into our hearts.

This week's gospel reminds us that Jesus is the only way to God and to heaven and that we must walk in the way of Jesus's teachings if we are to lead a holy life. As Catholics, we also encounter walk along this path sacramentally--through the Eucharist, reconciliation, Mass and prayer, where Jesus continually leads us closer to the Father.

The gospel reminds us that heaven is not a "future thing" but the road to heaven begins now, in our relationship with Jesus. He has already prepared a place for us there, are we ready and willing to make our way to Him?

Prayer: Jesus, You are the way, the truth and the life. Help me to remember every day that I can put my trust in you. When my heart is troubled and my path uncertain, help me to find peace in you knowing that you have a plan for me that is bigger and better than anything I can imagine. Strengthen my faith, Lord, so that I can follow Your way, wherever that may lead. Fill my heart with your love and let that love overflow into all aspects of my life so that I may live out my Catholic calling. Amen.
