GOSPEL Luke 23:35-43


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

COMMENTARY

The Power of Remembering

If you memorise a tune or your 'times tables', you are said to 'know it by heart'. The sort of person who will always remember me is someone who 'knows me by heart'.

Here, a tortured criminal starts his plea: 'Jesus . . .'. This is one of only two instances where Jesus is addressed by his name which means 'The Lord saves'. The good thief went on: 'remember me when you come into Your Kingdom'. Jesus 'knows him by heart' and promises that He will re-member him in Paradise.

This is an exercise of sovereignty which befits 'Christ the King'. This is all the kingly power which you or I will ever need, but to confidently invoke it we need to position ourselves alongside Jesus, like the 'good thief'. We do this by our practical concern for the poor and by coming to Mass which re-members the Body of Christ.

We could pause for a moment to pray: 'Jesus, remember me, know me by heart, for when you do I will be in Paradise.'

Youth Corner

Youth Corner 23/11/2025

Scripture: Luke 23:35-43

Observation:

In today's gospel we see people in the crowd challenging Jesus' divinity, even at his crucifixion, asking if He is truly our Lord and Savior, why he could not save Himself. Jesus endures constant mockering and torture throughout His crucifixion, focused on His mission of salvation. Our attention is subsequently drawn to the two criminals, which perhaps represents a dichotomy of the faithful and faithless (or the repentant and bad thief), where one joins in the beratement, whilst the other humbly acknowledges his wrongs and expresses his fear of God. He asks for Jesus' remembrance and is promptly promised unity in Paradise immediately. I remember when I first read this as a young child, I was surprised at the Lord's mercy. I wondered how a thief who had committed sinful crimes was forgiven so easily. I failed to recognise the heavier significance of repentance, God's forgiveness and most importantly, simply believing.

Application:

There are two main takeaways from today's gospel. The first is that faith can certainly be difficult in the face of constant questioning and mockery. Just as Jesus is questioned of his divinity, we may be questioned for our beliefs in this increasingly secular society, where the church's teachings are often denied or condemned. I'm sure many of us have experienced instances where people may give some strange looks as we say grace before our meals or you may have debated with non-Catholic acquaintances regarding contentious topics such as abortion or euthanasia. I know that, in my fear of being isolated or condemned, I have avoided engaging in such conversations at times, or have been insufficiently prepared to defend my faith in such situations. As such, it is crucial that we are ready to defend our faiths; that we continue to strive to learn more about our faiths in order to be witnesses of God.

The second main takeaway is the importance of repentance and the Lord's mercy. "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." (Matthew 7:7) - rather than materialistic goods or successes, let us continue to ask for God's guidance and mercy, for we are sinners - and God will answer as we've seen today. Jesus loves us so immensely that He died on the cross for our salvation, and in His life Jesus teaches us to love and to be free from fear. Through this, it is reinforced that Jesus' kinship is far from control, power and luxury but rather His desire for compassion and communion in the Kingdom of God. And I think that is reason enough that we should continue to celebrate Christ in our lives and imitate him and his love in our daily lives.

Prayer:

Dear Lord, thank you for always remembering us and for your great mercy. In periods of darkness and adversities please guide us in remembering Your love just as you remember each and everyone one of our needs. I pray that we continue to strive towards imitating Jesus' love in our lives and may the Holy Spirit strengthen us, and provide us with wisdom and a helmet of faith so that we may defend our faith in the face of doubt and condemnation. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen!
