GOSPEL

Mt 2 : 13 – 15. 19-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Matthew

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you, and escape into Egypt, and stay there until I tell you, because Herod intends to search for the child and do away with him.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, left that night for Egypt, where he stayed until Herod was dead. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken through the prophet:

I called my son out of Egypt.

After Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you and go back to the land of Israel, for those who wanted to kill the child are dead.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, went back to the land of Israel. But when he learnt that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as ruler of Judaea he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he left for the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way the words spoken through the prophets were to be fulfilled:

He will be called a Nazarene.

COMMENTARY

Two Holy Families

Herod is seeking to annihilate all the male children in Bethlehem. The child Jesus is in mortal danger. 'Arise, take the child and his mother, and flee into Egypt.' And Joseph did so. That night and by night, such was the urgency.

Have you ever thought: What if Egyptian border guards had turned back this refugee family? What if, instead of finding safe haven and sanctuary, this desperate family had been denied entry? The Divine plan to rescue Jesus from a murderous tyrant depended not only on Joseph but, also, on the Egyptian people.

And so we discover two Holy Families in this Gospel episode. One is the little Holy Family with Joseph, Mary and Jesus. The other is the larger Holy Family of humanity embodied in those Egyptians who provided sanctuary, who opened their land to allow Joseph, Mary and Jesus to settle out of danger.

We might pause for a moment to ask: Can we be as hospitable and open as the Egyptians of today's Gospel? Another baby in another family of refugees may depend on our answer!

Scripture: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

Observation: Today's Gospel recounts the Holy Family's escape to Egypt and their subsequent return to Nazareth. Though fairly short, the passage hints towards Jesus' status as our saviour. The escape to Egypt is not simply just about escaping the tyranny of Herod, but also a recounting of Israel's history. Like the Israelites once were, Jesus, Mary and Joseph are forced out of their home and wind up in Egypt, though the nature of the time spent in Egypt obviously differs from the Israelite's time as slaves.

The subsequent return, draws parallels to Moses' exodus, and through this, Jesus is painted as the new Moses - one who will lead God's chosen peoples out of the grasp of Sin.

Additionally, this passage also serves to highlight the providence of God. Of course, going to Egypt was not in Joseph's plan for his family, and yet it was exactly what God had planned. Even their eventual settling in Nazareth served to ready Jesus for his eventual role.

Analysis: We can learn a few things from the Gospel today. Perhaps most importantly, and similar to what I touched on above, is the idea of obedience even in the darkest moments. When Joseph was told to flee, he was likely terrified, confused and uncertain, but despite all that he did not hesitate. He did what was told of him despite being unable to see the full picture. Likewise, we are often presented with opportunities in our daily lives, big and small. The true measure of our faith is not in understanding why we are faced with these circumstances, but rather our willingness to go forth, trusting in God.

Another key part of the passage was the settlement in Nazareth. It was here that Jesus grew up in general peace. Similarly, we often go through periods of 'silence' where it may seem like nothing is really happening. However, instead of sitting idle, we should take this time to prepare ourselves and strengthen our faith. These quiet moments are perfect for contemplation and meditation, so don't let them go to waste!

Prayer: Dear Lord, thank you for your unceasing guidance. Even when we do not see the path you have chosen for us, you stay by our side and lead us to greater things. Please continue to watch over us and help us to always find the courage to step into the unknown, if it be your will. Amen.
