COMMENTARY

The Perfume of Holiness

What does it mean to be 'holy'? It does not mean 100% morally correct, or separate from the great mass of people: 'Holier than thou'! It means being so close to God that God's holiness rubs off.

We are adopted members of the Holy Family, and something rubs off.

Each one of us has heard at our baptism 'You are my beloved son/daughter'. We have been adopted into God's family and that brings us into close proximity to God.

So, if St Paul were writing to us today, as he did to the Corinthians, this is how it would run: '... to the church of God that is in [your town], made up of those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called holy.'

But, we are not alone. In a multitude of places there are people who have also been baptised and therefore share a certain family resemblance. How is the 'togetherness' held together? By being in communion with the Bishop of Rome, the official role of the Pope.

We might pause for a moment to thank God that we are amongst the baptised who can receive St Paul's greeting: 'Grace and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.'

Scripture

John 1:29-34

Observation

In this passage, John sees Jesus, declaring to us all that he, the one who has been foretold about, will be the sacrificial lamb who takes away the sins of the world. In this one sentence, John the Baptist summarized the greatest work of Jesus: to deal with the sin problem afflicting humans. Also, John then also points out the ever-presence of Jesus, stating that although Jesus was born after him, connotating the eternal nature of Jesus, thus God also. Through this, John declares to us all that Jesus is the true God and saviour.

Application

"Takes away the sins of the world," says John. Not just the church, but of the world. The wording here is sleight, in that it is not only Catholics, Christians etc, that are saved, but all on this earth. With this, we can ask ourselves, why all of us? Why does he save everyone? Even those who may not be followers, may not worship him, or even recognize him. In the same book, John 12: "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself", it encapsulates who and where he is from. Although he is of the church, he is also of the earth, and as a result, of all people on this earth. We are reminded the scope of Jesus' love for us. We are made in the image of God, and through that there is a belief that we are all inherently good and worth to be saved, despite where you lay.

Prayer

Lord, pray for us for when we may stray from your path. Give me the courage and strength to do you will to live a faithful life, and to be reminded of your forgiveness and love that you bless us with.
