A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians


I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul?

For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed. *The word of the Lord*

GOSPEL

Mt 4 : 12-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Matthew

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali!
Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan,
Galilee of the nations!
The people that lived in darkness
has seen a great light;
on those who dwell in the land and shadow
of death a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.

COMMENTARY

The Voice of Jesus

Two sets of two brothers were running successful family businesses. But once Jesus passed by and called them, the Gospel says, at once they left their boats and followed him. I think because, hearing his voice, they realised that Jesus was the true vocalist of God.

Irish author and mystic, John O'Donohue, once wrote, 'Something in us senses and knows how perfectly the contours of the soul fit the divine embrace.'

Maybe Simon Peter, Andrew, James and John sensed that, in this Jesus, there was a Soul whose contours perfectly fitted the divine embrace. They were prepared to risk everything for the chance to have their souls contoured along the same lines.

The call: 'Follow me ...', was not to an isolated individual promising to save his soul, but to two brothers and then another two brothers. Immediately, a community was being formed and its task was to bring others into that Jesus-following community.

We could pause for a moment to hear the brothers beckoning us to follow the call of that voice sounded by Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Youth Announcements

Scripture: Matthew 4: 12-23

Observation:

During Jesus's lifetime, Galilee was a region that was often looked down upon by the Jews. To them, it wasn't a particularly holy place because it was heavily shaped by Greek and Roman culture, meaning the people who lived there, including the local Jewish population, knew less about God. It also didn't help that the vast majority of Jewish temples, priests, and scholars were based in Jerusalem, which inevitably left Galilee overshadowed and overlooked.

However, as we discover in today's Gospel, Jesus deliberately chose to start his Earthly ministry there. Not only that, but he also chose to start during a particular hard time in his life – right after his beloved cousin, John the Baptist, was unlawfully arrested and sentenced to death. Jesus began by giving the people of Galilee some much-needed encouragement to repent and follow God, before then calling on his very first disciples – four insignificant, working-class, Galilean fishermen. Thus, a great light had truly begun to appear for the Galileans, the same light that has now spread all across the world and will one day replace all of its darkness.

Application:

Jesus sets the perfect example for us today, in terms of what to do when we are facing dark and difficult times. He doesn't sit and wait, but instead, gets going with what God intended – and that was for him to work on his Earthly ministry. As for what God intends for us when we ourselves are struggling, particularly with things like confusion, doubt, or loneliness; Jesus teaches us what to do in today's Gospel as well – to repent and realign ourselves towards God. Some ways we can do this include coming to Youth Group even when we don't feel spiritual, or taking that first, brave step to go to confession for the first time in a while. You see, God doesn't wait for us to "perfect ourselves" first before calling on us to follow him, and nothing emphasises this more than today's Gospel, where Jesus extends this invitation to four burnt-out, struggling fishermen. God calls on all people, including the spiritually weak, and does so more than willingly.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father. In a world rife with darkness and faithlessness, I thank you for shining your never-ending light onto me and all my Earthy brothers and sisters and showing me that no one is unworthy of your love and discipleship. Let me also extend my gratitude towards you for sending your beloved son down to us, so that I could be free from sin, and have a perfect example to follow. In his name, I pray. Amen.
