Mt 14 : 13-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Matthew

When Jesus received the news of John the Baptist's death he withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and, leaving the towns, went after him on foot. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them and healed their sick.

When evening came, the disciples went to him and said, 'This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food.' Jesus replied, 'There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.' But they answered, 'All we have with us is five loaves and two fish.' 'Bring them here to me,' he said. He gave orders that the people were to sit down on the grass; then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves he handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining, twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children *The Gospel of the Lord*

COMMENTARY

Feeding of the Hungry Crowd

Note the disciples' reaction to the plight of the hungry crowd: 'Send the people away so that *they* can buy.' The disciples have gone for the fix which puts no responsibility on them. They are willing to entrust the hungry crowd to market forces. Those with money can eat: those without, can't. For the disciples, money and commerce are the answers to hunger.

Jesus rejects that solution. 'There is no need for them to go; give them something to eat yourselves.' The solution to the hunger of that crowd was to give generously what little the disciples had. What they could have kept for themselves was to become gift. Once the disciples were in Jesus' frame of mind, the hunger of the crowd was satisfied. How did this come about? The answer lay in human cooperation with the impulse of Divine generosity which knows no limits. The story simply says that Jesus blessed and broke the loaves 'and handed them to his disciples who gave them to the crowd.' Jesus depended on the disciples to obey him: 'Give them something to eat yourselves'.

Jesus still looks with gut-wrenching compassion on those who are hungry in our own society and throughout the world. If we answer that market forces will suffice, Jesus will reject our answer as decisively as he rejected the answer of his earliest disciples. We have to take responsibility to share what we have, to be generous with what we have. After all, Jesus, Our Lord and Master, *commands* us: 'Give them something to eat yourselves'. Note how Jesus blessed those loaves and broke them before they were distributed, which reminds us of the words of Pedro Arrupe, former General of the Jesuits, 'Eucharist will never be complete so long as people still go hungry in the world.'

We could pause for a moment at Mass to ask: Who are those hungry people crowding in on us, and then pray that we may respond to them as our Lord commanded, so that the hungry of the crowd, and our hunger to really follow our Lord, *will be satisfied*.

Scripture – Matthew 14:13-21

Observation:

There will be times in our life where we have suffered or failed, feel uncertain about the future or feel hurt or grief and it is important not to give into these emotions and feelings of despair. We see this in the Gospel of Matthew today through Jesus. After having made known the death of John the Baptist, Jesus, like many others who lose a loved one, would've been overcome with grief and sorrow, and yet he is full of compassion when he sees a crowd of followers. It is evident then, that in these moments of darkness, we should not give into these emotions and sense of failure or anguish, but rather to offer what we have and embrace the love that God so wants to bestow us.

Jesus also reveals his divinity in performing the miracle of completely alleviating the hunger of men and women using what seems to be a measly number of resources. The crowd was made up of five thousand men, not including women and children, and yet when all they had was five loaves and two fish, Jesus takes them, blesses them and breaks the loaves and gives them to the disciples to feed the people. Every person that ate was satisfied with twelve baskets of food to spare. Jesus thereby shows whatever that can be offered to God, is multiplied, providing true satisfaction in abundance.

Application:

It can feel easy to follow Christ and live a faithful life when things are going well; when there is little uncertainty, stress, or broken relationships in our life. However, Jesus is overwhelmingly compassionate when all we can offer is our faith in him even when there is brokenness around us. No matter who we are, young or old, poor or rich, we can offer what we have to participate in the faith. And Jesus having shown that even with scarce resources, he multiplies what is giving up to him. So, with our humble offerings, whatever they may be – 10 minutes to listen to daily scripture, a decade of the rosary or an Our Father, Jesus will perform great works and give us the fill that we need.

Prayer:

Dear Jesus,
Help us in times of uncertainty, anguish and unease, and show a compassionate heart to others. Grant us the fortitude to trust in your love and generosity especially when we are doubtful, disheartened or feeling lukewarm. Guide us to meet with those who hunger and are in need and help us to reveal the fulfillment of the Word to others. Amen.
